

ENTRY AGREEMENT

I (we) acknowledge that I (we), all exhibitors, handlers and patrons, know and abide by the "CKC Dog Show Rules" and that I am (we are) familiar with their content. I (we) agree that the Northern Alberta Canine Association has the right to refuse this entry for just cause, which the Club shall deem to be sufficient. In consideration of the acceptance of entries made in these all-breed shows, obedience trials, agility trials or any of the associated Specialties, and of the holding of these shows and of the opportunity to have the dog judged and to win prize money, ribbons or trophies, I (we) agree to hold the Northern Alberta Canine Association and associated Specialty Clubs, their members, directors, governors, officers, agents, superintendents, or show secretaries, and the owner or lessor of the premises and any employees of the aforementioned parties, harmless from any claim for loss or injury which may be alleged to have been caused directly or indirectly to any person or thing by the act of a dog while in or upon the show premises or grounds or near any entrance thereto, and I (we) further agree to hold the aforementioned parties harmless from any claim for loss of a dog by disappearance, theft, death or otherwise, and from any claim for damage or injury to the dog, whether such loss, disappearance, theft, damage or injury be caused or alleged to be caused by the negligence of the Club(s) or any of the parties aforementioned, or by the negligence of any other person, or any other cause or causes.

I (we) hereby assume the sole responsibility for and agree to indemnify and save the aforementioned parties harmless from any and all loss and expense (including legal fees) by reason of the liability imposed by law upon any of the aforementioned parties because of bodily injuries, including death at any time resulting therefrom, sustained by any person or persons, including myself (ourselves) or on account of damage to property, arising out of or in consequence of my (our) participation in these shows and trials, howsoever such injuries, death or damage to property may be caused and whether or not the same may have been caused and whether or not the same may have alleged to have been caused by negligence of the aforementioned parties or any of their employees or agents, or any other person.

RULES GOVERNING THESE SHOWS

1. Dogs must be kept on a leash at all times on the show grounds or within the show building.
2. The Club reserves the right to remove any person from the show. The Show Superintendent shall have full control of these shows and trials, which will be governed by CKC rules.
3. ANYONE PARKING IN THE FIRE LANES OR OTHER AREAS DESIGNATED AS "OFF LIMITS" WILL BE REMOVED FROM THE SHOW.
4. All recreational units must have buckets underneath for their drains. Those discharging of any water on the grounds will be removed by order of the health department and subject to a fine.
5. A judge officiating at this show held under CKC rules shall not be subjected to any indignities of any kind during the progress of the show. (4.7.1)
6. A show-giving club will be held responsible during the show for the conduct of exhibitors and spectators. Any person acting in an abusive or objectionable manner must be removed from the show on complaint to the Show Superintendent (5.1.6)
7. There is to be NO SMOKING in the large show tent, nor entrances to it, and NO SMOKING is allowed in the show building.
8. Dogs must be on the show grounds 1 hour prior to judging of their breed.
9. All vehicles are left on the show grounds at your own risk. No security is provided.
10. No abuse of parking personnel, NACA members or volunteers will be tolerated!!
11. RV's will not be allowed to travel on the show grounds when judging is occurring. Under special circumstances (in case of emergency) the show superintendent will stop the show and parking personnel will assist in the safe removal of vehicle.

All dogs defeated, either directly or indirectly up to the Breed level, are to be including in the count. In counting the number of eligible dogs in competition, a dog that is disqualified, dismissed, excused or ordered from the ring by the judge shall NOT be included in the calculation for championship points. In addition, points are awarded to a dog awarded Winners which also places in the regular Group competition:

A class dog awarded Best in Show at an all-breed championship show will be credited with the five (5) points inclusive of any points earned at the breed or group level. In no case may a dog earn more than five (5) points at a single show. In order for a dog to be issued a CKC Championship Certificate the dog must: earn at least 10 Championship points under at least 3 (three) different judges, be individually registered in the records of the CKC or have an Event Registration Number, and have earned at least one 2 (two) point win at the breed or group level.

Introducing Our Judges

CHERYL BISHOP- I was born, raised and still reside in Kitchener, Ontario. I have been involved with dog training since 1980 when I became interested in having a great family pet. It was not long afterwards that my focus also took me to obedience competitions.

Over the years I have competed in both Canada and the US obtaining obedience titles on my dogs. I have also enjoyed competing in both agility and flyball. As a past member of the K-W Kennel Club I held many executive offices and chaired many committees.

My family consists of my three dogs. Poseidon is my fearless two year old Shetland Sheepdog. Next is my three year old Golden named Knockout who loves to come and help me teach obedience classes. My oldest is my 11 year old Golden named Tracker.

DARWIN BOWLES – I have been involved in the dog world for the past 15 years. I am a CKC and AKC Licensed Obedience and Rally Judge. My personal choice of breeds is the Golden Retriever and I am the President of the Golden Retriever Club of Canada, as well as being the Obedience Director of my local club.

My wife and I share our home with Standard Poodles, a Border Terrier and a new Golden pup. My wife and I operate an obedience school and we also facilitate obedience-related seminars both in Canada and the States. My wife and her Standard Poodle have been in the top 10 Obedience in Canada for the past 3 years.

In my non-dog world, I am a learning Consultant and Professor, which provides me with a lot of tools and techniques to apply when working with our dogs.

I would like to thank the Club for asking me to judge at your trials. Best of luck to all competitors. (Mr. Boles is also judging the Great Dane Obedience Trial at this show.)

DR. RENE ECHEVARRIA-COFINO – Dr. Echevarria-Cofino is a Physician and Surgeon who has been involved in the dog world since 1982, a Miniature Pinscher being his first show dog. Later on, in 1985, he started breeding and showing Argentine Dogos. He obtained numerous National, Regional, International, and Great Champions titles. He was awarded with the #1 Argentine Dogo in the United States Title in 1990. Additionally, with Miniature Pinschers, he obtained many other championships as well, earning the World Champion Award in 1997.

From 1998 to the present, Dr. Echevarria-Cofino has served as the President of the Puerto Rico Kennel Club, which is a member club of the American Kennel Club. For many years he has been an active member of the Federacion Canofila de Puerto Rico, collaborating in the 1997 World Dog Show, Las Americas Tournaments, and several other International Expositions. Furthermore, he collaborated in the 2nd and 7th Annual Congress Meeting for Judges and Breeders for Las Americas and the Caribbean in the years 2002 and 2007.

He is a co-founder of the Argentine Dogo Club of the United States of America and a former Vice-President of the Caribe Kennel Club of Puerto Rico, also a member club of the American Kennel Club. In 1994 this organization (CKC) recognized him with the President's Award issued for his dedication and help to the canine development in Puerto Rico.

In 2006 he was the evaluating judge for the First Promotion of All Rounder Judges of AERCAN (Asociacion Ecuatoriana de Registros Caninos) in Quito, Ecuador.

Actually, he is an All Breed International Judge, FCPR/FCI licensed, having judging assignments in many countries such as: Argentina, Australia, Brazil, British Virgin Islands, Canada, Colombia, Costa Rica, Chile, Dominican Republic, Ecuador, Guatemala, Mexico, New Zealand, Panama, Peru, Poland, Puerto Rico, United Mr. Ennis has also exhibited English and Irish Setters. He is a lifetime member of the American Spaniel Club and currently serves as the Judges Education Chairman.

As a Visiting Judge; in the United States he is an AKC licensed judge (#82464) as well as in Canada (#5702). He is also the first FCI Latin American judge to become an Active Member of the American Dog Show Judges (ADSH) and the Canadian Dog Judges Association (CDJA). (Dr. Echevarria-Cofino is also judging the Papillon specialty at this show).

ROBERT D. ENNIS – Mr. Ennis resides in the United States and has dedicated a lifetime to the sport of purebred dogs. As a child he grew up with an American Cocker Spaniel. It is this breed that he has continually owned and exhibited for almost 50 years. Along with his many American Cocker Spaniels, Mr. Ennis' judging career began in 1992. Initially he was approved to judge American Cocker Spaniels,

English Setters and Irish Setters. He has been privileged to judge specialty shows in all three of these breeds throughout the United States and Canada. Included with these honored judging assignments, Mr. Ennis has also judged at the prestigious Westminster K.C. on four occasions. In 2009 he judged the Sporting Group and awarded Group 1 to the veteran Sussex Spaniel, which later went on to win Best in Show. Upon returning to Canada Glen sought out and purchased a Belgian Tervuren from an American breeder who best represented the Tervurens he saw in Europe and the rest, as they say, is history. Glen bred over 60 Champions with both Canadian and American titles in both Conformation and Obedience.

Glen has professionally shown many other breeds throughout his career in all 7 Groups including Scottish Terriers, Shetland Sheepdogs, Rottweilers, Cairn Terriers, Golden Retrievers, Labrador Retrievers, Poodles, Cavaliers, Dandies, Bouviers and many others. In addition, he taught handling classes for over 25 years.

Glen began his judging career in 2004 and is currently a licensed CKC judge for Herding, Working, Terrier breeds and on permit for the first half of Toys.

For the last 12 years Glen has bred Shetland Sheepdogs with his wife Cheryl Pike under kennel name "MacLaren". (Mr. Stark is also judging the Bouvier des Flandres and Shetland Sheepdog specialties at this show).

BETTY- ANNE STENMARK – Betty-Anne was born and raised in North Vancouver, BC. She showed her first dog at the Nanaimo Kennel Club. She met and married the American, Roy Stenmark, at his first judging assignment in 1974. They married and moved to the San Francisco Bay area the following year. Betty-Anne first bred Saint Bernards but it's been Dandie Dinmont Terriers since 1975 under the King's Mtn. prefix. She has been the Show Chairman of Del Valle Dog Club for 33 years; sits on the AKC Trial Board and is a Board Member of "Take the Lead". This past year she was voted **Judge of the Year** by "The Fancy", an award presented at the Purina Pro Plan/Dogs in Review event in New York. (Mrs. Stenmark is also judging the all-Terrier specialty at this show)

SANDY WHEAT – I was born in Tokyo, grew up there with a pet dog Japanese Spitz. When I came to the USA years ago I did not speak English and only knew "yes" and "no". Several English words were similar to Japanese words but many could not be translated. I study English very hard and still studying today.

I purchased Pekingese in the US in 1979. This Pekingese could finish if I knew then what I know now. I started to exhibit in Obedience and took two Pekingese to their CDX title: a mother and a daughter; mother was wonderful and did everything I asked her to do, finished in 3 shows, while the daughter, who was more the conformation type and a thinking girl, seemed to out-smart my command at every turn, taking forever to acquire her CDX title.

The Obedience training helped me for the conformation. I purchased a quality pair of Pekingese from ST AUBREY ELSDON kennel which led me to finish 86 Champions in less than 15 years. I have finished 9 Champions in 1988 Breeder/Owner/Handled by myself. I had BIS and BISS's. My most memorable experience in showing dogs was when I received my first Group 1, bred by me, owned and handled under the hot Arizona's sun of over 100 degrees in the afternoon! I never forget the judge said (Mildred Bryant) ... if a Pekingese can never give up and move like that under this Hot Sun, it deserves a Group 1!

Later, realizing the hard work of exhibiting and not getting any younger, I decided to embark on another challenge by trying to make a positive impact in the breed through judging. I am glad I started out judging Toys and always say "if you handle Toys (or any breed) roughly you can ruin their disposition and some will never show again". I am approved to judge the Toy Group, Non-Sporting Group, herding Group and some Working breeds.

When I am not judging I love history and to travel and have travelled around the world, from the North Pole to the South Pole. Just a few of the places have been: Europe, South America, Alaska, Pacific Islands (Tahiti, Galapagos, Easter Islands) and other small islands. Borneo, Asia, Amazon, Australia, Penguin Island. One of the most memorable travel experiences was the World War II Remembrance Military tour where I was able to be at the locations of Iwo Jima and the Invasion of Normandy – it was a very emotional tour indeed. Thank you. Sandy Wheat

LOIS WILSON – I was born into a dog owning family in Zimbabwe (then Rhodesia) and have continued that interest with passion! I grew up with Airedales, Cocker Spaniels, and English Setters.

The Dog Show scene in Rhodesia, where I grew up, was small; I helped owners handle their dogs, so my interest in different breeds of dogs evolved.

After moving to Amanzimtoti South Africa, I was given a German Shepherd, and helped handle the breeder's dogs. I acquired my first Siberian Husky in 1988. My Kennel name SIBRA is registered with the Kennel Union of Southern Africa (KUSA). After visiting America in 1992 I fell in love with the Japanese Shiba Inu and am now the top breeder of Shiba's in South Africa.

My first judging appointment was in 1976 and after moving to South Africa, I worked my way through the KUSA's Breed Judges Qualifying scheme. I have also passed the UK Kennel Club's Conformation exam. I am approved to judge all-breeds and Best in Show at the Championship Show level in South Africa. I have judged in South Africa, Zimbabwe, America, England, Ireland, Australia, New Zealand, Brazil, Thailand, Canada, India and the Philippines.

I also have a great interest in Junior Handling, both my children took part. I have visited numerous shows in England (including Crufts) Ireland and World Shows in Europe, extending my knowledge of the different breeds, enjoying every minute, marveling, as so many do, at the quantities and quality of dogs. I have made many friends on these trips.

Effective January 1, 2011 - Non-Member Participation Fee

(This only applies to dogs wholly owned by non members and is not applicable to CKC members or dogs co-owned with a CKC member, nor does it affect US exhibitors who must apply for an ERN number as noted above)

A non-member resident in Canada is subject to the fee. Dogs co-owned with a CKC member are exempt. There are 2 options for non-members: a) Join the CKC or b) Pay the Non-Member Participation Fee

The fee is a yearly charge based on the calendar year January 1st to December 31st in which the awards, legs, points, titles, etc. were achieved. It is not based on the number of dogs or titles or awards earned, and is assessed against the owner(s).

Non-members will receive a letter from CKC Head Office informing them that they have 30 days to join the Club or pay the Non-Member Participation Fee. Dogs co-owned by two or more individuals ... the first person listed in the CKC dog records will be considered the caregiver of the dog and all communication will be sent to this person.

Payment of the Non-Member Participation Fee or becoming a CKC member will protect all awards, points, titles and legs in the calendar year in which they were earned. Failure to pay the fee within 30 days of the notice will result in all awards, legs, points, titles being cancelled. Once cancelled the awards, legs, points or titles will be given to the next applicable dog. Once cancellation takes place any subsequent awards titles, legs, etc. earned will automatically be cancelled without further notice.

The Non-Member Participation Fee is applicable starting at the first event in which the dog earns awards, points, titles, legs and is not prorated.

**Please note that the CKC Membership application and the Non-Member Participation Fee forms are available on the website under CKC Services and then Forms On-Line. CLASSIFICATION

Non-members who require class details are asked to call the Show Secretary at 780-988-5020 or by email at Maldawn@aol.com It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to be familiar with the Conformation, Obedience & Rally rules as set out by the Canadian Kennel Club

CONFORMATION

The following CKC conformation classes (divided by sex) will be offered:

Junior Puppy: for dogs 6 mths of age but under 9 mths of age.

Senior Puppy: for dogs 9 mths of age but under 12 mths of age

12-18 Months: for dogs 12 mths of age and under 18 mths of age

Canadian Bred: for dogs born in Canada; champions in any country excluded.

Bred by Exhibitor: for dogs owned and handled in the ring by the breeder.

Open: for all dogs.

Specials Only: dogs which are registered individually in the records of the Canadian Kennel Club and have attained championship status may be entered in the 'Specials Only' class. Exhibition Only: for all dogs over 6 mths of age and eligible for registration with the CKC (non-competitive class).

Veterans: offered Saturday and Sunday only. Veterans will be divided Males and Females with a Best of Breed judged for each. The Best of Breed winner will go on to Best Veteran in Group and Best Veteran in Show. Dogs must be 7 years or older on the day of the show.

Altered: offered Saturday and Sunday only. Altered will be divided Males and Females with a Best of Breed judged for each. The Best of Breed winner will go on to Best Altered in Group and Best Altered in Show. All dogs must be surgically altered to enter this show.

OBEDIENCE

Pre-Novice: for any pure bred dog that has not earned the title PCD (Pre Companion Dog) title in

Canada. Dogs in this class may be handled by the owner or any other person. A dog may be entered in this class that has not earned the title of CD in Canada or US.

Novice A: for any purebred dog that has not won the title of CD. Only one dog may be entered in this class by any one exhibitor. A dog which has won a comparable degree in any foreign country is not eligible for this class.

Novice B: for any purebred dog that has not won the title of CD in CANADA. Dogs in this class may be handled by any person. More than one dog may be entered by any handler, but each dog must have a separate handler for the 'sit' and 'down' exercise. A dog which has won a comparable degree in any foreign country is eligible for this class.

Novice C: for any purebred dog that has gained a CD, CDX, UD or any other advanced title and exercises will be performed and judged as described in the official Novice classes. Scores earned in Novice C are not eligible for High in Trial. This is an elective class and offered for those people who feel the dog requires ring experience. Dogs may be entered in Novice C class in addition to any of the Official Classes or Unofficial classes.

Open A: for any purebred dog that has won the title of CD but has not won the title of CDX. Only one dog may be entered in this class by any one exhibitor. A dog which has won a comparable degree in any foreign country is not eligible for entry in this class.

Open B: for any purebred dog that has won the title of CD, CDX or UD in CANADA. Dogs in this class may be handled by any person. A dog which has won a comparable degree in any foreign country is eligible for this class. A dog may be entered in both Open A and Open B at any one trial. A dog eligible for UD is also eligible for entry in this class at the same trial.

Utility A: for any purebred dog that has won the title of CDX in CANADA. Handlers may enter more than one dog in this class, but each dog must have a separate handler for the 'group examination' exercise.

Utility B: for any purebred dog and handler where the dog has achieved a CDEX and a UD title and for dogs and handlers where the handler has put a MOTCH title on any dog.

RALLY

Rally Novice A: Dogs entered in this class may not have won a CKC Rally Novice title or any CKC Novice Obedience title.

Rally Novice B: Any dog may compete in this class until a qualifying score in the Rally Advanced Class is earned. No dog may be entered in Rally Novice A and Rally Novice B at any one trial.

Rally Advanced A: For dogs that have won the Rally Novice title but have not won the Rally Advanced title or any CKC Novice Obedience title.

Rally Advanced B: for dogs that have won the Rally Novice title. No dog may be entered in both Rally Advanced A and Rally Advanced B at any one trial.

Rally Excellent A: for dogs that have won the Rally Advanced title but have not won the Rally Excellent title or any CKC Novice Obedience title.

Rally Excellent B: for dogs that have won the Rally Advanced title. No dog may be entered in the Rally Excellent A and Rally Excellent B class at any one trial.
