A listing fee must be paid with the entry fee if the dog does not have an individual CKC registration number.

Note: there is no listing fee for 3-6 month puppies. The litter registration number cannot be accepted.

Please note that fees are payable in Canadian funds. Due to fluctuating currency, discounted cheques will not be accepted.

Personal cheques will be accepted, however they are payable in Canadian funds. To simplify the process, we urge that you purchase bank drafts or money orders payable in Canadian funds.

ENTRY INFORMATION

1. No dog under six months of age is permitted to enter the show/trial premises except preregistered puppies 3-6 months of age that are with the owner who has other dogs entered in regular classes of the show. These puppies will not be listed in the catalogue but must be pre-registered by the owner at, or before, the closing date and time of entries (or see note 3 below).
2. Puppies 3-6 months of age may be entered in the 3-6-month class at these shows. There is no listing fee for such entries.
3. No entry will be accepted unless accompanied by the entry fee.
4. Tendering of an NSF cheque as payment of entry fees shall be considered to be non-payment of entry fees and is an offense punishable by disciplinary action and cancellation of awards.
5. Entrants must abide by any errors made in entering their dogs. The Event Secretary will not be responsible for checking the accuracy of entries. Errors should be brought to the attention of the Event Secretary.
6. The committee reserves the right to refuse entries subject to CKC rules.
7. The Event Secretary will be unable to accept or cancel entries after the closing date.
8. Telephone, fax, or any other electronic entries are prohibited except in such circumstances as the CKC Board of Directors may otherwise authorize. (*Chapter 8 Dog Show Rules*)
9. Every dog entered in a championship show must be registered or eligible for registration in the Stud Book of the CKC.
10. Entry forms must be completed in full. Incomplete entry forms must be rejected by the event-giving club and returned. Please double-check your entry.

CHAMPIONSHIP POINT RATINGS

The schedule to be employed in the determination of the number of points to be allocated to the dog awarded winners shall be:

Dogs competing (including dog awarded winners):

In counting the number of eligible dogs in competition, a dog that is disqualified, dismissed, excused or ordered from their ring by the judge shall not be included in the calculation for championship points.

In addition to championship points allocated at the breed level, a dog awarded Best of Breed that also places in the regular group competition shall be credited with the following additional points provided that a dog was defeated at the group level.

Additional points are awarded at the **Group Level**:

In no case may a dog earn more than 5 (five) points at a single show.

A dog awarded Winners that also places Best in Show at an all-breed conformation show shall be credited with five (5) championship points inclusive of any points earned at the breed and group level.

For a dog to be recognized as a champion it must win at least 10 points under 3 different judges, which includes at least one 2-point win. This 2-point win must be at the breed or group level.

General Information

On the day of the show/trial, the show/trial superintendent will be in complete charge of the show/trial.

After closing of entries, a receipt and judging schedule must be mailed to all exhibitors.

Only dogs properly entered in the show/trial will be admitted.

The building will be opened one hour before the start of the show/trial.

Dogs may be removed from the building when not required for further judging.

Dogs **must not** be left in the building overnight.

Judging will proceed without any dog not present when called by the ring steward.

The show/trial committee will use due care and diligence for the welfare of the dogs and the exhibitors, but will not be responsible for, or assume any liability, in the event of an accident or other misfortune to either dogs or patrons.

If because of riot, civil disturbance, or other acts beyond the control of the management, it is impossible to open or complete the show/trial, no refund of entry fees will be made.

It shall be the duty and obligation of the show giving club to see that a judge, club official, volunteer, or any participant at an event held under these rules is not subject to indignities. The Conformation Show Committee Chair shall promptly report to the CKC any infringement of this regulation. The Discipline Committee shall have the authority to take such action as it deems fit on receipt of a report indicating that this has occurred.

The show/trial grounds are defined as the confines of the Bay Arena, Bay Roberts, NL.

The authorities of the shows/trials may decline to accept entries for just cause, and/or refuse to receive or may remove any dog from the show/trial building because viciousness or disease. **No one shall have any claim or recourse against the organization holding the show or any official connected therewith for the refusal of entry.**

NEW RULE CHANGE

Exhibitors are reminded of the new change in the Show and Obedience Rules. Effective immediately, the section dealing with Disqualifying or Excusing Dogs common throughout the rulebooks for all disciplines has been amended (March 2016 CKC Board meeting) - Chapter 14.1.2 has been replaced. Details are or will soon be available there. 14.1.2 (a) allows a judge to excuse or disqualify any dog which threatens, menaces, attempts to bite or bites the judge, another person, or another dog in the ring. When a dog is twice excused on this account, it shall have the status of a disqualified dog. 14.1.2 (b) A judge shall also have the authority to permanently disqualify a dog which bites the judge or another person in the ring. Dogs disqualified under this provision will not be eligible for reinstatement. The decision to permanently disqualify a dog must be clearly indicated on the Judge's Disqualification Form. Sections 14.1.4, 14.1.5, and 14.3.1 are also amended to comply with the above changes.

*** SETUP. Setup for these events will be on Friday August 11th. Times will be given on the judging schedule. Volunteers to help with this are welcome and encouraged.

Exhibitors will not be allowed to begin setup until all rings have been placed.

***** OPENING OF EVENT SITE. The building will be open to all exhibitors one hour before judging starts on both days. Dogs may not be left in the building overnight.

CANADIAN KENNEL CLUB Non-Member Participation Fee (Effective January 1, 2011)

Policy:

Non-member participation fee

- a) An annual fee for awards and titles will be charged to a Canadian non-member of CKC.
The fee will match the ERN fee.
- b) In order to protect the awards/titles earned, the non-member will have the option to become a CKC member or pay the non-member participation fee. Failure to comply within 30 days of notification will result in all awards and titles being cancelled.
- c) All Premium Lists will carry a note stating the fees apply only to dogs wholly owned by non-members and is not applicable to CKC members.

Information:

- A non-member resident in Canada is subject to the fee. Dogs co-owned with a CKC member are exempt.
- There are 2 options for non-members:
 - a) Join the CKC
 - b) Pay the Non-Member Participation Fee
- Dogs co-owned by two or more individuals; the first person listed in the CKC dog records will be considered the caregiver of the dog and all communication will be sent to this person.
- The fee is a yearly charge based on the calendar year January 01 to December 31 in which the awards, legs, points, titles, etc. were achieved. It is not based on the number of dogs or titles or awards earned, and is assessed against the owner(s).
- Non-members will receive a letter from CKC Head Office informing them that they have 30 days to join the Club or pay the Non-Member Participation Fee.
- Payment of the Non-Member Participation Fee or becoming a CKC member will protect all awards, points, titles and legs in the calendar year in which they were earned.
- Failure to pay the fee within 30 days of the notice will result in all awards, legs, points, titles being cancelled. Once cancelled the awards, legs, points or titles will be given to the next applicable dog.
- Once cancellation takes place, any subsequent awards, titles, legs etc earned will automatically be cancelled without further notice.
- The Non-Member Participation Fee is applicable starting at the first event in which the dog earns awards, points, titles, legs and is not prorated.

***Please note** that the CKC Membership Application and the Non-Member Participation Fee forms are available on the website (www.CKC.ca) under CKC Services and then Forms On-line. If submitting a Membership Application, please ensure that you also complete the Non-Member Participation Fee form so that we are aware of the dogs involved.

CONFORMATION

Regular official classes at this CKC Championship Show shall be as described below.

JUNIOR PUPPY

Dogs 6 months of age and under 9 months of age on the day of the show.

SENIOR PUPPY

Dogs 9 months of age and under 12 months of age on the day of the show.

12 TO 18 MONTHS

Dogs 12 months of age and under 18 months of age on the day of the show.

BRED BY EXHIBITOR CLASS

Dogs owned and handled in the ring by the breeder.

OPEN

For all dogs.

SPECIALS ONLY

Dogs which have a recorded CKC Registration number or an Event Registration Number and have attained the required points for Canadian Championship status. Dogs entered in this class will compete for Best of Breed, Best of Opposite Sex and Best Puppy in Breed, if eligible.

BABY PUPPY

Dogs 3 months of age and under 6 months of age on the day of the show.

EXHIBITION ONLY

All dogs entered shall be listed in the catalogue with the same particulars as for a dog entered in competition.

CANADIAN BRED CLASS

Dogs born in Canada. Champions of any country are excluded.

Exhibitors wanting more information about the above classes should check the relevant chapters of the CKC Dog Show Rules.

OBEDIENCE TRIALS AND RALLY OBEDIENCE TRIALS

All regular classes

Suitable prizes will be awarded in Obedience for High in Trial

Rosettes will be awarded in Rally Obedience for High in Class

Separate entries are required for each class entered. You must state jump heights.

Dogs entered in Obedience or Rally must have at least one of the following:

Mixed breeds and non-recognized breeds with the appropriate Canadian Kennel Club REG. Number; or ERN Number; or MISC Cert Number; or PEN Number; or CCN Number.

Obedience and Rally Trial Ring will be at least 40 ft. x 50 ft.

Exhibition Only -- All dogs entered shall be listed in the catalogue with the same as for a dog entered in competition

OBEDIENCE AND RALLY OBEDIENCE RULES HAVE CHANGED EFFECTIVE JANUARY 1, 2015 For further information on obedience trials, please refer to the Obedience and Rally Trial Rules & Regulations available at CKC online or contact the CKC Obedience Trial Representative for NL, Mr. Tony Moores.

A separate entry form is required for each class in an obedience trial. To facilitate setting up jumps for open and utility, please state the height jumped on each entry form.

A bitch in season **may not** compete in an obedience trial. Entry fees will be refunded when a bitch comes in season after the entries close when a veterinarian's certificate to this effect is presented to the show/trial secretary prior to the start of the first trial.

Dogs in obedience must wear a well-fitted plain buckle or slip collar. Slip collars of any appropriate single length of leather, fabric, or chain with two rings, one at each end are acceptable. There shall be nothing hanging from the collar.

OBEDIENCE CLASSES

Pre-Novice: for any pure-bred dog that has not earned the title PCD (Pre Companion Dog) title in Canada. Dogs in this class may be handled by the owner or any other person. A dog may be entered in this class that has not earned the title of CD in Canada or US.

Novice A: for any purebred dog that has not won the title of CD. Only one dog may be entered in this class by any one exhibitor. A dog which has won a comparable degree in any foreign country is not eligible for this class.

Novice B: for any purebred dog that has not won the title of CD in CANADA. Dogs in this class may be handled by any person. More than one dog may be entered by any handler, but each dog must have a separate handler for the 'sit' and 'down' exercise. A dog which has won a comparable degree in any foreign country is eligible for this class.

Novice C: for any purebred dog that has gained a CD, CDX, UD or any other advanced title and exercises will be performed and judged as described in the official Novice classes. Scores earned in Novice C are not eligible for High in Trial. This is an elective class and offered for those people who feel the dog requires ring experience. Dogs may be entered in Novice C class in addition to any of the Official Classes or Unofficial classes.

Novice Intermediate: For any dog that has earned a CD or higher obedience title. Dogs may compete in the Novice Intermediate class indefinitely. Scores earned by dogs competing in this class are NOT eligible for High in Trial.

Open HA & Open 18A: The Open A classes shall be for any dog of any recognized or listed breed, mixed breed or unrecognized breed that has earned the title of CD but has not earned the title of CDX. The handler of any dog in these classes must be the owner, co-owner or a member of their immediate families. Only one dog per handler is allowed in these classes and that person must handle the dog in all exercises. Any person who has trained or exhibited a dog that has earned a UD title may not handle a dog in these classes.

Open HB & Open 18B any dog of any recognized or listed breed, mixed breed or unrecognized breed that has earned the title of CD. Dogs that have earned the title of CDX or any higher obedience titles may enter either of the Open B classes. A dog may also be entered in the Utility class in the same trial. Dogs in these classes may be handled by the owner or any other person. A person may enter or handle more than one dog in these classes.

Utility A: for any purebred dog that has won the title of CDX in CANADA. Handlers may enter more than one dog in this class, but each dog must have a separate handler for the 'group examination' exercise.

Utility B: for any purebred dog and handler where the dog has achieved a CDEX and a UD title and for dogs and handlers where the handler has put a MOTCH title on any dog.

RALLY CLASSES

Rally Novice A: Dogs entered in this class may not have won a CKC Rally Novice title or any CKC Novice Obedience title.

Rally Novice B: Any dog may compete in this class until a qualifying score in the Rally Advanced Class is earned. No dog may be entered in Rally Novice A and Rally Novice B at any one trial.

Rally Intermediate: For dogs that have earned the RN title. A dog completing the RI or any other obedience or rally titles may continue to compete in this class indefinitely. Dog handled by owner or any other person.

Rally Advanced A: For dogs that have won the Rally Novice title but have not won the Rally Advanced title or any CKC Novice Obedience title.

Rally Advanced B: For dogs that have won the Rally Novice title no dog may be entered in both Rally Advanced A and Rally Advanced B at any one trial.

Rally Excellent A: For dogs that have won the Rally Advanced title but have not won the Rally Excellent title or any CKC Novice Obedience title.

Rally Master: For dogs that have earned the RE title. A dog completing the RM title may continue to complete in this class indefinitely. The owner or any other person may handle dogs in this class. A person may enter more than one dog in this class.

JUNIOR HANDLING

Junior handling will be held on Sunday during the lunch break. Competitors are asked to please fill out the pre-registration form included.

Entry forms will be available at the event secretary's desk and must be submitted at least one hour before the start of the junior handling competition. All dogs used for junior handling must be entered in a regular official class (can be exhibition only) at the show or trial on Sunday. The dog must be entered in the show/trial by entry close date **July 26th**, 2019. The scheduled time for the competition will be listed in the Judging Schedule. The fee is \$5.00 for each day of competition.

Class Structure

Peewee

Children up to 6 years of age. This is a non-competitive class.

Junior Novice

Handlers 6 to 11 years old who have not achieved four first placements in this class.

Junior Open

Handlers 6 to 11 years of age who have achieved four first placements in the Novice class or any handler wishing to enter this level. Once the handler has entered and competed in the Open class, he cannot compete in the Novice class again.

Intermediate Novice

This class is for handlers 11 to 14 years of age as of December 31st of the year preceding the competition year, who has not won 6 first places in the same class with competition.

Intermediate Open

This class is for handlers 11 to 14 years of age as of December 31st of the year preceding the competition year, who have won 6 first places with competition and for any handler who has progressed through the Junior Open level and feels that he has enough experience to compete at this level.

Senior Novice

Handlers 12 to 17 years of age who have not achieved four first placements in this class.

Senior Open

- Handlers 12 to 17 years of age who have received four first placements in the Senior Novice class.
- Handlers who have previously competed in an open class in either junior or senior.
- Handlers who have progressed through the Junior Open class and feel that they have enough experience to compete at the level.
- Handlers (junior or senior) who have received some type of monetary consideration for showing a dog.
- Once a handler competes in the Senior Open class, s/he cannot compete in any other class.

Best overall is optional at the discretion of the host club.

Notice for Junior Handlers:

Effective January 1, 2016, in accordance with Junior Handling Rules and Regulation, Junior Handlers will be required to apply to the CKC Head Office for a Junior Handling Number.

“Junior Handlers, with the exception of PeeWees, must apply to CKC Head Office on the appropriate form for a Junior Handling Number **within 30 days** of competing in their first Junior Handling event. The Junior Handling Number will be used by the Junior Handler for the duration of their Junior Handling career. If a Junior Handling number is not obtained, Junior Handling points earned will not be tracked.”

The application can be mailed, faxed, or e-mailed to CKC Head Office. There is no fee.

It is the responsibility of every exhibitor to be familiar with the CKC rules governing these events. Copies of the Rules and regulations are available online from ckc.ca

It is your responsibility to double-check your entries for accuracy and ensure that all necessary information is provided.

Incomplete entries will not be accepted.

Junior handlers are eligible to compete in the above class structure from their eighth birthday until they reach their eighteenth birthday.
