*TCN – Temporary Competition Number MUST be obtained from the CKC prior to entering any CKC event. TCNs will replace the previous system of entering events with dogs as “listed” and will allow dogs to temporarily participate in CKC events while they pursue permanent registration or an Event Registration Number (ERN). A TCN, MCN, ERN or CKC registration number is required for Baby puppies to enter, however the TCN entry fee is NOT paid on a baby puppy entry.

Should you wish to withdraw your entry between the time that you enter and the close of entries you will receive a full refund of entry fees (any Credit Card, Apple Pay, Interac or etransfer service charges WILL NOT be refunded as per dogshow.ca policy.) COVID Rules and Regulations

By entering this Show, you are agreeing to the rules and regulations laid out in this Premium List. The Show Superintendent will be in full charge of the show, which will be governed by CKC rules. At the time of this Premium List being posted the Government of Alberta has moved into Stage Two of the Public Health Measures, which means that virtually all restrictions have been lifted and all public health orders have been rescinded, with the exception of isolation and quarantine requirements and masking mandates in healthcare settings. Masking at the show is not mandatory with the following exception: If a judge is wearing a mask in the ring, please be respectful and wear your mask as well. If you do not bring a mask, one will be provided for you at a cost. As we are uncertain of Alberta Health Services/Government restrictions at the time of this show we ask all exhibitors to respect the rules that may be in place at the time of the show.

Should there be any changes in the Government of Alberta, Canada or City of Edmonton protocols we will follow all Covid Guidelines in place.

There will be a PHOTOGRAPHER at this show they may have their own COVID-19 Protocols in place.

REFUND POLICY

- If the Northern Alberta Canine Association/All Associated Specialties are required to CANCEL shows due to any Alberta Government, City of Edmonton, Ottewell Curling Club or Canadian Kennel Club guidelines, policies, or directives; a partial refund of entry fees (less our unrecoverable costs) will be offered. All DogShow.ca service fees are not refundable.
- If you are refused entry due to Covid-19 Symptoms or testing positive for Covid-19, you will not be given a refund.
- If you cannot travel to the show due to a government restriction on travel, refunds will not be given a refund.
- Credit card and Dogshow.ca charges will not be refunded (DogShow.ca policy)

Violation of any of these rules and procedures will result in your entries for the weekend being cancelled with NO refund of entry fees. There will be NO EXCEPTIONS AND NO EXCUSES.

Be respectful to each other, the volunteers and let us keep each other safe.

If you have personal objections to or feel unable to comply with our restrictions which are based on the most current guidelines from Alberta Health Services, then please do not enter this show.

Any breach of the requirements will result in dismissal from the show with no right of entry fee refund.

All Covid Rules MUST be followed by all exhibitors, and they may be subject to change should the Provincial or Federal Covid-19 Restriction's change

Rules and Regulations

ATTENTION Canadian Exhibitors who are not CKC members – Non-member Participation Fee

***** Payment of this new fee is not required to enter this show*****

This fee only applied to dogs wholly owned by non-member residents of Canada and is not applicable to CKC members or dogs co-owned with a CKC member, nor does it affect US Exhibitors who must apply for an ERN number. For full description and rules please see the NACA premium list available at www.dogshow.ca

Dogs should be in the building at least one hour prior to ring time. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to be aware of the posted schedule and be at ringside at the time of judging. The club will not call individual dogs to ringside. Please remain at ringside until judging is completed. A practice ring will be set up in the benching area. Regular rings must not be used for this purpose. Dogs must be exercised in the areas provided, anyone exercising their dogs on the grounds outside the building and not cleaning up after them, will be excluded from the show or trial.

Exhibitors are reminded to respect hospitality facilities. The Club reserves the right to refuse future entries from any exhibitor who creates excessive destructive or disruption to host facilities (Hotel, motel or campground). The show superintendent is in complete charge of the shows and trials which, are governed by CKC rules. No judge or any other person participating in any capacity at a dog show held under CKC rules shall be subjected to an indignity of any kind during the progress of the show. The Show Committee has a responsibility to see that this rule is enforced. Chapter 19.7, Page 55, CKC Conformation Show Rules and Regulations.

The Dog Show Committee will use due care and diligence for the welfare of dogs, exhibitors and spectators, but will not be responsible for, nor assume any liability in the event of accident or misfortune. The Club and the specialty club reserves the right to remove from the shows or trials any person or dog for any just cause. Any dog excused by the show superintendent or veterinarian, for any reason, shall not compete in any classes or accept any awards for the duration of the shows or trials. No refund of any fees will be made.

If because of riot, civil disturbance, or any other acts beyond the control of the show committee, it is impossible to open or complete the show, no refunds shall be made!

EXTRACTS FROM THE DOG SHOW RULES - BREEDS, CLASSES, AWARDS AND STAKES

CONFORMATION CLASSES OFFERED:

12.2.1 Regular official classes at a CKC conformation show shall be as described in (a) to (k) of this section. All classes must be divided by sex (except for Specials Only). Only dogs entered in one of the regular, non-regular, or unofficial classes shall be allowed within the show precincts.

JUNIOR PUPPY: shall be for dogs at least six months of age and under nine months of age on the day of the show.

SENIOR PUPPY: shall be for dogs 9 months of age and under twelve (12) months of age on the day of the show.

12-18 MONTH - for dogs over 12 months of age but under 18 months of age.

CANADIAN BRED: shall be for dogs born in Canada, Champions of any country excluded

BRED BY EXHIBITOR: shall be for dogs owned and handled in the ring by the Breeder. The handler must be the owner/co-owner AND breeder/co-breeder of the dog. The owner/breeder must handle the dog in this class, but need not handle the dog for further awards.

OPEN CLASS: shall be for all dogs.

VETERAN Dogs must be 7 years of age and over on the day of the show. Dogs entered in this class may be spayed or neutered. This class at a specialty MAY be divided by age. The winners of all of the Veteran's classes will come back into the ring to compete for Best of Breed.

SPECIALS ONLY: is for dogs which have a recorded CKC Registration or Event Registration Number and have attained the required points for Championship status including at least one 2 point win either at the breed or group level. Should a dog which is entered in this class be found either not to be registered or has not completed the requirements for Championship status, all awards earned at the show will be cancelled. Dogs entered in this class will compete for Best of Breed, Best of Opposite Sex and Best Puppy if eligible.

UNOFFICIAL/NON-REGULAR CLASSES OFFERED

(with the exception of Baby Puppy all entries in these classes MUST be entered in a regular Class or as Exhibition Only)

BABY PUPPY Dogs 4 months of age and under 6 months of age on the day of the show. The award for this class are: Best Baby Male and Best Baby Female Best Baby Puppy in Breed Best Baby Puppy in Group Best Baby Puppy in Show

BRACE At an all-breed or specialty show a club may, but is not required to, offer a Brace Class. This class shall be for 2 dogs of the same breed (not necessarily of the same sex). A Brace should be judged as an identical pair – same colour, size, gait, and same stride. When viewed from the side they should appear as one dog and its shadow. A brace must be handled by 1 person on 1 lead.

STUD DOG Stud dog and 2 or more of his get, not necessarily owned by the same owner. Get MUST be entered in a Regular Class.

BROOD BITCH Brood Bitch and two or more of her progeny, not necessarily owned by the same owner. Progeny MUST be entered in a Regular Class

ALTERED: Eligibility for the Sexually Altered Dog Classes shall be limited to dogs over 6 months of age which have been sexually altered by veterinary procedure. Points MAY NOT be carried from the regular competition judging to the Altered Dog Class judging. These classes will be judged immediately after Best of Breed of the regular classes. Two classes will be offered: **Altered Male & Altered Female**. Classes will be placed first through fourth in both sexes, the first place winner from each class will be declared Winners and the second place winner will be declared Reserve Winners. The Altered Winners Male and the Altered Winners Female will then compete for Best of Breed Altered and Best of Opposite Sex Altered in breed.

STRIP DOWN: Shall be offered for any CKC registered American Cocker Spaniel of any age over 6 months (including neutered or spayed dogs). Length of hair is required to be trimmed to a maximum length of 1 ½ inches long on any portion of the body, with the exception of the ears where no length restrictions apply. Entrants are to be judged on conformation. All males will be judged first as one class, and then all bitches will be judged as the second class. The winners of these two respective classes will compete for Best in Stripped Down. Entrants must be entered in a Regular Class in the Specialty, Obedience Trial or Agility, or Exhibition only to compete in the Stripped down Class.

NOTICE TO U.S. EXHIBITORS RE: ERN NUMBERS

Dogs that are foreign born and foreign owned and enter Canada for the sole purpose of entering CKC events do not require a CKC registration number, but will require an Event Registration Number (ERN). This ERN does not register a dog with the CKC for breeding purposes as defined in the Animal Pedigree Act, but rather enables a foreign born and foreign owned dog to be awarded titles by the Canadian Kennel Club. Each dog must have its own number. To obtain an ERN number, mail or fax a photocopy of the dog's foreign registration certificate with a cheque or Visa/MasterCard number (expiry date, cardholder's name and signature) in the amount of \$62.40 payable to the Canadian Kennel Club. Provide your complete address for return of the ERN. This Event Registration Number must be applied for within 30 days of the first day of entering a CKC event. Please forward your request to The Canadian Kennel Club, Shows and Trials Division, 200 Ronson Drive, Suite #400, Etobicoke, Ontario, M9W 5Z9.

PAYMENT OF ENTRY FEES BY U.S. EXHIBITORS

Current exchange rate favours the American dollar. To take full advantage of this, please purchase bank drafts or money orders payable in Canadian Funds. Personal cheques will be accepted, however, they must be payable in U.S. funds, and for the full amount of the entry. Please do not mark personal cheques payable in Canadian funds, or 'at par' as such items are not readily cleared through the banks. Your cooperation is appreciated!

BORDER CROSSING

A Rabies Certificate is required to bring a dog into Canada. Government regulations require this certificate and it MUST be updated at least thirty days prior to re-entry into the U.S.

SHOW RULES AND GENERAL INFORMATION

1. Showing correct information on entry forms is the responsibility of the entrant. The show committee reserves the right to refuse any entry subject to CKC rules. Entry forms must be the same size and format as those included or they will be rejected.
2. No entry will be accepted unless accompanied by entry fees. Telephone entries will not be accepted.
3. Withdrawal of entries prior to closing date may be made by telephone but **MUST BE FOLLOWED UP IN WRITING** to the Show Secretary so as to be received by the closing date. Entry fees will not be refunded in the event that a dog is absent, sick, lame, excused by the veterinarian or judge, in season or barred from competition because it has been entered incorrectly.
4. The entry of any dog cannot be altered or cancelled after entries close, except as provided in the Dog Show rules.
5. If, because of riot, civil disturbance or other acts beyond the control of the management, it is impossible to open or to complete the show, no refund of entries will be made.
6. Exhibitors are to pick up after their dogs both inside and outside of the show building; any exhibitor not doing so, will be removed from the show.
7. No dogs are allowed to run loose at any time.

Entries sent by Courier must be sent prepaid: To comply with instructions issued by the Canadian Kennel Club, we will be unable to accept any entry reaching our Show Secretary after the closing time and date.

Entries sent requiring a signature WILL NOT BE accepted.

Please allow ample time for delays in the mail.

Exhibitors Please Note: An exhibitor has the right to withdraw an entry at any time up to the closing date and time as published in the premium list. This may be done by telephone but **written or electronic notification must be received by the show secretary not later than closing date and time.** If written or electronic notification is not received, the dog will remain entered in the show.

CHAPTER 4 – JUDGES

SECTION 19.7 It shall be the duty and obligation of the show-giving club to see that a judge, club official, volunteer, or any participant at an event held under these rules is not subject to indignities. The Conformation Show Committee Chair shall promptly report to the CKC any infringement of this regulation, and the Discipline Committee shall have the authority to take such action as it deems fit on receipt of a report indicating that this has occurred.

General Information

Please note – This is an Outdoor Camping Show – Judging of American Cocker Spaniels will be held inside for the specialty **only**

NOTE

IMPORTANT: all RV camping MUST be booked and paid for in advance. Because of the large amount of RV's at this show, this rule will be strictly adhered to and anyone arriving without prior booking will not have a space. There are NO power hook ups, water-fill or dumping facilities available for RV's for those staying on the grounds. There will be warm water and a grooming table/dog bath tub on a cement pad for bathing dogs; there are public washrooms inside the building, port-a-potties placed around the show site, and a coin operated warm water shower outside.

Those that require power will have to have their own generators or other form of power with them. There will be no benching inside the specialty building.

Extracts From CKC Dog Show Rules

Chapter 8 Entries and End of Show Section

8.2.5 An error in an age specified class, date of birth or sex may be amended on the entry form up to one hour before the start of the show.

Section 8.3.1 Entries: Every dog entered in a Championship show must be one of the following:

- a) registered with the CKC,
- b) have an Event Registration Number,
- c) be eligible for registration with the CKC, or
- d) if it belongs to a listed breed, it must have a Miscellaneous Certification Number (MCN).

Section 8.4.1 Listed Dogs: If a dog is not registered as in 8.3.1 (a) or (b) but is eligible for registration with the CKC, it may be entered at a show as a listed dog provided:

- b) that if born in Canada, it is eligible for individual registration;
- c) that if not born in Canada, is eligible for registration in the records of the CKC.
- d) that if it is a foreign born and owned dog, an Event Registration Number or CKC registration number is obtain from the CKC within 30 days of the first show entered.

Section 8.4.2 Entry of a listed dog at a show must be accompanied by a listing fee as set by the Board in addition to the regular entry fee.

Section 8.5.1 Acceptance of Entries: If indicated in the premium list, an electronically transmitted entry may be accepted provided the entry is accompanied by a credit card charge authorization.

Section 8.5.3 No entry shall be accepted from or on behalf of any person who is officially known to be expelled, deprived of privileges, debarred or suspended by the CKC or any other registering body for pure bred dogs.

Section 8.5.4 After entries close, no further entries may be accepted, cancelled or substituted other than as otherwise stated in this section or as provided for in case of a postal strike.

Section 8.6.1 Refusal of Entries: The authorities of any show may:

- a) decline to accept entries for just cause, and/or
- b) refuse to receive or may remove any dog from the show building on account of disease or viciousness.
- c) in the case of non-acceptance, refund the fee with the reason for non-acceptance.

Section 8.8.2 Fees: Tendering of a dishonoured cheque or declined credit card in payment of an entry fee shall be considered non-payment of said fee and is an offense punishable by disciplinary action and cancellation of awards.

Section 8.9.1 Moving a Dog to Specials: A dog which is individually registered in the records of the CKC or that has a Miscellaneous Certification Number (MCN) and has completed the requirements for a Championship in accordance with these rules but at the time of the closing of entries for a show has not received confirmation of the title, may be transferred from one of the regular classes to Specials Only providing the transfer is submitted to the Show Secretary in writing by the owner or handler at least one hour prior to the opening of the show.

Section 8.9.2 If it is established that a dog transferred to Specials Only has not completed the Championship requirements, all awards will be canceled and all ribbons and prizes won shall be forfeited. The owner may also be subject to disciplinary action.

Section 8.9.3 When one or more All-Breed and/or Specialty Shows are held on the same day, in the same venue, the moving of class dogs to Specials must be made prior to the scheduled opening of the first show.

Chapter 4 Judges Section 4.1.3 A judge officiating at a show held under these rules shall not be subjected to indignities of any kind during the progress of the show. It shall be the duty and obligation of the club holding the show to see that this rule is effectively carried out.

Section 4.1.6 No person may approach a judge either directly or otherwise, orally or in writing, to favor his entry. Disciplinary action will be taken against any person who violates this rule or against a judge who fails to report any contravention of this rule to the CKC within 14 days of the act.

Chapter 14 Disqualifying or Excusing Dogs

Section 14.1.2 (a) At his discretion, a judge shall have the authority to excuse or disqualify a dog which menaces, threatens, attempts to bite or bites the judge, another person, or another dog in the ring. When a dog is twice excused on this account, it shall have the status of a disqualified dog.

(b) At his discretion, a judge shall have the authority to permanently disqualify a dog which bites the judge or another person in the ring. Dogs disqualified under this provision will not be eligible for reinstatement. The decision to permanently disqualify a dog must be clearly indicated on the Judge's Disqualification Form.

Section 14.1.4 Once a dog has been disqualified for any reason at a conformation show, it may not be entered or shown at another show until

the dog has been reinstated by the CKC. All awards earned by a dog shown in violation of this section will be cancelled by the CKC and the owner of the dog is subject to disciplinary action. A dog disqualified under section 14.1.2 (b) is not eligible for reinstatement.

Section 14.1.5 Any dog that is disqualified under section 14.1.2(a) shall automatically be disqualified from entering in any CKC event in any other discipline until such time as the dog is officially reinstated, if the dog is eligible for reinstatement.

Championship Points and Cancellations

Section 15.1.1 A dog awarded Winners at a conformation show shall be credited with a number of championship points (ranging from 0 to 5) and the number of championship points credited to a dog awarded Winners shall be as provided hereunder.

Section 15.1.2 The schedule to be employed in the determination of the number of points awarded Winners shall be as follows:

Dogs competing*	1	2	3-5	6-9	10-12	13 & more
Points allocated	0	1	2	3	4	5

*Includes the dog awarded Winners.

In counting the number of eligible dogs in competition, a dog that is disqualified, dismissed, excused or ordered from the ring by the judge shall NOT be included in the calculation for championship points.

Section 15.1.3 If a Dog awarded Winners was also awarded Best of Breed then at the show all dogs competing in the breed, including Specials Only, shall be included the total.

Section 15.1.4 If a Dog awarded Winners is also awarded Best of Opposite Sex to Best of Breed, then all dogs of the same sex including those competing for Specials Only shall be included in the total.

Section 15.1.5 If a Dog awarded Winners is also awarded Best of Winners, then all dogs defeated directly or indirectly in the breed shall be included in the total.

Section 15.1.6 If a dog is awarded Winners only, then all the dogs of the same sex in the class competition shall be included in the total.

Section 15.1.7 The number of championship points to be credited to a dog awarded Winners shall be determined by the highest award earned and calculated as per this section.

Clarification: Example of directly or indirectly defeating: If the Winners Bitch is awarded Best of Opposite Sex but not Best of Winners, the Best of Winners Male shall be deemed to have indirectly defeated the Specials Bitches, and is thus entitled to add them to the number of dogs and bitches defeated.

Section 15.1.8 In addition to championship points allocated at the breed level, a dog awarded Winners which also places in the regular Group competition shall be credited with the following additional points provided that the dog was defeated at the Group level.

Section 15.1.9 A dog may not be credited with more than 5 championship points in a single show:

Section 15.1.10 A breed or class shall not be allowed more than 2 sets of championship points per sex on any day in the same venue.

Section 15.1.11 A dog awarded Winners which also places Best in Show at an all-breed conformation show shall be credited with 5 championship points inclusive of any points earned at the breed and group level.

Section 15.1.12 In order for a dog to be recognized as a Champion and its owner provided with a Championship certificate, the dog must:

- (a) earn at least 10 championship points under at least 3 judges; and,
- (b) be individually registered in the records of the CKC or have an Event Registration Number.
- (c) have earned at least one 2 point win either at the breed or group level.

15.2 Grand Champion (GCh) (47-06-12)

Section 15.2.1 The title of Grand Champion may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation championship.

Section 15.2.2 Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the conformation championship and do not include the points earned in attaining the conformation championship.

Section 15.2.3 To be awarded a Grand Champion title, a dog must attain a minimum of 20 points, which must include a minimum of two (2) wins of at least two (2) points each. Points may be gained at breed, group or Best in Show/Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

(a) Grand Champion Point System
Points towards the Grand Champion title, at breed level, are awarded to the Best of Breed, Best of Opposite Sex, Select Dog and Select Bitch. Points are calculated based on the number of animals competing at the breed level for the Best of Breed winner and the number of similar-sex dogs competing for the other three (Best of Opposite, Select Dog, Select Bitch). The following schedule shall be employed in the determination of points awarded at breed level:

(b) In order to obtain a Grand Champion title, a dog must obtain at least two (2) points after 12 months of age.
In counting the number of eligible dogs in competition, a dog that is disqualified, dismissed, excused or ordered from the ring by the judge shall not be included in the calculation for Grand Champion points.

15.3 Grand Champion Excellent (GChEx) (48-06-12)

Section 15.3.1 The title of Grand Champion Excellent may only be earned after the completion of the CKC grand championship title.

Section 15.3.2 Points for this title may be accumulated at any time after the completion of the CKC grand championship but does not include the points earned in attaining the conformation championship or the grand championship.

Section 15.3.3 A minimum of 100 points, which must include one (1) Best in Show or a Best of Breed at a breed national specialty (where a minimum of 10 dogs have competed) plus three (3) Group 1st or three (3) breed specialty wins. Grand Champion Excellent point system

Win	Points
First in Group or Best in Specialty Show	5
Second in Group or Best of Opposite Single-Breed Specialty Show	4
Third in Group	3
Fourth in Group (Note: No points are acquired if no other dog is present in the group.)	2
Best of Breed (To earn the breed point, at least five (5) dogs must be shown at breed level.)	1
Best in Show or Best in National Specialty Show	10

Section 15.3.4 Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward. For example, a dog that wins first in group and then wins Best in Show, earns 10 points, not 15.

Section 15.3.5 The title of Grand Champion Excellent shall not be awarded retroactively. However, dogs that have been awarded the Grand Champion title prior to January 1, 2013, will be awarded the Grand Champion Excellent title on application to the CKC.

Section 15.3.6 Additional Requirements

To attain a Grand Champion Excellent title, a dog must have been awarded a CKC performance title from any CKC event. A CGN, Herding Tested certificate or Chase Ability Program title are not considered performance titles for the awarding of this title.
