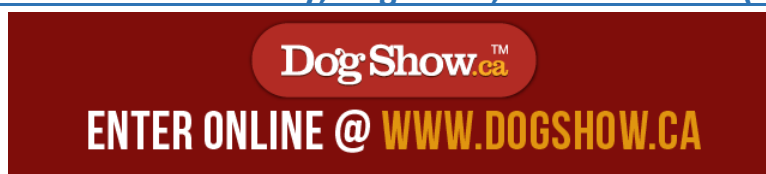

SHETLAND SHEEPDOG VERSATILITY CHALLENGE

This award recognizes those Shetland Sheepdogs that exemplify true versatility by successfully competing in Conformation and Performance Events, either at the SSFC Specialty (Conformation) or Designated Booster Events at Northern Alberta Canine Association (Obedience & Rally on Saturday, September 11th only))

Eligibility: \$10.00 Entry Fee and MUST be acknowledged on entry form

To be eligible to participate for this award, a Shetland Sheepdog must enter and compete in a **minimum of 2 events** offered on the SSFC specialty weekend – rally, obedience and conformation (see eligible classes below), any combination is acceptable.

Shetland Sheepdogs that have attained one of the following conformation titles prior to the closing date of the specialty (champion, grand champion, or grand champion excellent), **need only to be enter and compete in one performance event** (to comply with the 2 event minimum). This applies to conformation titles in Canada only.

Move ups will not apply.

ENTERING multi events competition is encouraged, as the winner is the Shetland Sheepdog with the most points overall.

Scoring Criteria: These Points for the SSFC All Around Shetland Sheepdog Challenge are cumulative.

In order to get the 1 point from each of the groups listed below (you must not only enter, but you must participate). If you enter and do not show up, you will not be eligible for these points.

Obedience*	NACA Trial Booster ONLY – Saturday
1 pt	Show Shetland Sheepdog in Obedience
1 pt	Qualifying Score – Novice, Open or Utility
2 pts	1 st place SHETLAND SHEEPDOG in class - Novice
3 pts	1 st place SHETLAND SHEEPDOG in class - Open
4 pts	1 st place SHETLAND SHEEPDOG in class - Utility
6 pts	Highest Qualifying SHETLAND SHEEPDOG Score Overall in OBEDIENCE

Example: A Shetland Sheepdog enters = 1pt, if they place 1st in Open = 3 pts, , if they are Highest Qualifying Score

Overall = 6 pt 1 + 3 + 6 = 10 points

Rally*	NACA Trial Booster ONLY – Saturday
1 pt	Show Shetland Sheepdog in Rally
1 pt	Qualifying Score – Novice, Intermediate, Advance, Excellent or Masters
2 pts	1 st place SHETLAND SHEEPDOG in class – Novice or Intermediate
3 pts	1 st place SHETLAND SHEEPDOG in class – Advance and/or Excellent
4 pts	1 st place SHETLAND SHEEPDOG in class - Masters
6 pts	Highest Qualifying SHETLAND SHEEPDOG Score Overall in RALLY

Example: A Shetland Sheepdog enters = 1pt, if they place 1st in Advance = 3 pts, if they are Highest Qualifying Score

Overall = 6 pt 1 + 3 + 6 = 10 points

Conformation Points awarded ONLY from the Specialty

1 pt	Entered in regular conformation class
2 pts	Placement in Class (2 nd , 3 rd or 4 th)

Example: A Shetland Sheepdog enters = 1pt, if they place 1st = 3 pts, if they win Winners dog = 3 pts, and if they win Best of Opposite Sex = 6 pts.

In this example. 1 + 3 + 3 + 6 = 13 points

Dog DOES NOT have to be entered in the conformation SSFC to be awarded these additional points.	
Restrictions: Points are awarded at the highest title level – and titles must be obtained before the start of NACA shows.	
2 pts	Has earned a CKC Championship title prior to competition
4 pts	Has earned a CKC Grand Championship title prior to competition
6 pts	Has earned Grand Championship Excellent title prior to competition
2 pts	Has earned a Rally Novice, Rally Intermediate, Obedience Novice
4 pts	Has earned a Rally Advanced, Rally Excellent, Obedience Open
6 pts	Has earned a Rally Master, Obedience Utility

Example: A Shetland Sheepdog enters = 1pt, if they place 1st = 3 pts, , if they win Winners dog = 3 pts, if they win Best of Opposite Sex = 6 pts, and they also have an Grand Champion title = 4 pts.
In this example. 1 + 3 + 3 + 6 + 4 = 17 points

Winner will be the SHETLAND SHEEPDOG with the most points.

1st place – 50% of all proceeds received, PLUS Prize and Rosette

2nd place – 25% of all proceeds received and Rosette

3rd place – 25% of all proceeds received and Rosette

In the event of a tie, bonus points will be added to the tied scores based on level of competition in each event the dog participated in. The highest class competed in will be used, regardless if that score was used in the original calculation.

ATTENTION FOREIGN EXHIBITORS – EVENT REGISTRATION NUMBER

Effective Jan/1992 all dogs that are foreign-born and foreign-owned and enter Canada for the sole purpose of entering Canadian Kennel Club events will no longer require a CKC registration number but will require an ERN - Event Registration Number. An ERN does not register a dog with CKC for breeding purposes as defined in the *Animal Pedigree Act* but rather enables a foreign-owned dog to be awarded titles by the Canadian Kennel Club. Each dog must have its own ERN number. A CKC ERN registration form and ERN fee details can be downloaded from the CKC website: <http://www.ckc.ca> To obtain an ERN, mail or fax the Canadian Kennel Club the ERN form with a photocopy of the dog's foreign registration certificate plus a certified cheque, money order, VISA or MasterCard number (expiry date, cardholder's name and signature). Provide your complete address for return of the ERN to you. **ERN MUST BE APPLIED FOR WITHIN 30 DAYS OF FIRST DAY OF ENTERING A CKC EVENT.**

ATTENTION CANADIAN EXHIBITORS - CKC Non-Member Participation Fee

- a) An annual non-member participation fee for awards and titles will be charged to a Canadian non-member of CKC. The fee will match the ERN fee.
- b) In order to protect awards/titles earned, the non-member may EITHER become a CKC member OR pay the non-member participation fee. Failure to comply within 30 days of notification will cause all awards and titles to be cancelled.
- c) "these fees apply only to dogs wholly owned by Canadian resident non-CKC members and are not applicable to CKC members"

If submitting a Membership Application, please ensure that you also complete the Non-Member Participation Fee form so that the CKC is aware of the dogs involved.

NO ENTRY WILL BE ACCEPTED WITHOUT PAYMENT IN FULL. Tendering of an NSF cheque in payment of entry fees will be considered non-payment of entry fees and is an offence punishable by CKC disciplinary action and cancellation of awards. Overpayments and duplicate entries will be considered a donation to our trophy fund. Thank you! The owner of a dog entered in this show is entirely responsible for any error in the entering of his dog, regardless of how, or by whom the entry was made. An error in an age-specified class, date of birth or sex, may be amended up to one hour before the start of the show.

WITHDRAWAL OF ENTRIES

An exhibitor has the right to withdraw an entry up to the closing date and time as published in the premium list. This may be done by telephone but written or electronic notification must be received by the Show Secretary no later than the official closing date and time. If written notification is not received by that time, the dog will remain entered in the show

When a bitch comes into season after entries have closed, she may be withdrawn from the trial and the trial-giving club must refund the entry fee and listing fee providing the Trial Secretary receives, on or before the date of the trial, a veterinarian's certificate declaring that the bitch was in season within the 10-day period preceding the trial.

Kindly note that the SSFC (Shetland Sheepdog Fanciers Club), and/or its agents, may take candid photos, win photos, or videos of the specialty show, including but not limited to, images of the exhibitors and their dogs. Such images may be published by the SSFC in print or on the SSFC web-site without your consent. By entering the SSFC specialty show, you waive all rights to such images and agree that the SSFC may use them for its promotional or educational purposes, and without notice or compensation to you.

GENERAL INFORMATION AND REGULATIONS

Dog Show Rulebooks are available from the Canadian Kennel Club. Cost is \$6.30 per copy + 13% Ontario HST. The Show Superintendent will be in full charge of the show, which will be governed by CKC rules. All rules and regulations, as outlined in the NACA premium list, will also apply to this specialty. Entries will be acknowledged after entry closing, with receipt, judging schedule and exhibitor passes. If such acknowledgement is not received one week before the show date, please contact the Show Secretary. We welcome all exhibitors and spectators, including persons with disabilities. If you require accommodation of a disability, please make your accommodation known to the club in advance. Please contact the show secretary by entry closing to ensure that we can do our best to accommodate your needs.

Dogs should be in the building/on the show grounds at least one hour prior to ring time. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to be aware of the posted schedule and be at ringside at the time of judging. The club will not call individual dogs to ringside. Please remain at ringside until judging is completed. A practice ring will be set up in the benching area. Regular rings must not be used for this purpose. Dogs must be exercised in the areas provided, anyone exercising their dogs on the grounds outside the building and not cleaning up after them, will be excluded from the show or trial.

Exhibitors are reminded to respect hospitality facilities. The Northern Alberta Canine Association and the Specialty Club reserves the right to refuse future entries from any exhibitor who creates excessive destructive or disruption to host facilities (Hotel, motel or campground). The show superintendent is in complete charge of the shows and trials which, are governed by CKC rules. No judge or any other person participating in any capacity at a dog show held under CKC rules shall be subjected to an indignity of any kind during the progress of the show. The Show Committee has a responsibility to see that this rule is enforced. Chapter 19.7, Page 55, CKC Conformation Show Rules and Regulations.

The Dog Show Committee will use due care and diligence for the welfare of dogs, exhibitors and spectators, but will not be responsible for, nor assume any liability in the event of accident or misfortune. The Northern Alberta Canine Association and the specialty club reserves the right to remove from the shows or trials any person or dog for any just cause. Any dog excused by the show superintendent or veterinarian, for any reason, shall not compete in any classes or accept any awards for the duration of the shows or trials. No refund of any fees will be made.

If because of riot, civil disturbance, or any other acts beyond the control of the show committee, it is impossible to open or complete the show, no refunds shall be made!

EXTRACTS FROM THE DOG SHOW RULES - BREEDS, CLASSES, AWARDS AND STAKES

CONFORMATION CLASSES OFFERED:

12.2.1 Regular official classes at a CKC conformation show shall be as described in (a) to (k) of this section. All classes must be divided by sex (except for Specials Only). Only dogs entered in one of the regular, non-regular, or unofficial classes shall be allowed within the show precincts.

JUNIOR PUPPY: shall be for dogs at least six months of age and under nine months of age on the day of the show.

SENIOR PUPPY: shall be for dogs 9 months of age and under twelve (12) months of age on the day of the show.

12-18 MONTH - for dogs over 12 months of age but under 18 months of age.

CANADIAN BRED: shall be for dogs born in Canada, Champions of any country excluded

BRED BY EXHIBITOR: shall be for dogs owned and handled in the ring by the Breeder. The handler must be the owner/co-owner AND breeder/co-breeder of the dog. The owner/breeder must handle the dog in this class, but need not handle the dog for further awards.

OPEN CLASS: shall be for all dogs.

VETERAN Dogs must be 7 years of age and over on the day of the show. Dogs entered in this class may be spayed or neutered. This class at a specialty MAY be divided by age. The winners of all of the Veteran's classes will come back into the ring to compete for Best of Breed.

SPECIALS ONLY: is for dogs which have a recorded CKC Registration or Event Registration Number and have attained the required points for Championship status including at least one 2 point win either at the breed or group level. Should a dog which is entered in this class be found either not to be registered or has not completed the requirements for Championship status, all awards earned at the show will be cancelled. Dogs entered in this class will compete for Best of Breed, Best of Opposite Sex and Best Puppy if eligible.

UNOFFICIAL/NON-REGULAR CLASSES OFFERED

(with the exception of Baby Puppy all entries in these classes MUST be entered in a regular Class or as Exhibition Only)

BABY PUPPY Dogs 4 months of age and under 6 months of age on the day of the show. The award for this class are: Best Baby Male and Best Baby Female Best Baby Puppy in Breed Best Baby Puppy in Group Best Baby Puppy in Show

STUD DOG Stud dog and 2 or more of his get, not necessarily owned by the same owner. Get MUST be entered in a Regular Class.

BROOD BITCH Brood Bitch and two or more of her progeny, not necessarily owned by the same owner. Progeny MUST be entered in a Regular Class

Entries sent by Courier must be sent prepaid; To comply with instructions issued by the Canadian Kennel Club, we will be unable to accept any entry reaching our Show Secretary after the closing time and date.

Please allow ample time for delays in the mail.

Exhibitors Please Note: An exhibitor has the right to withdraw an entry at any time up to the closing date and time as published in the premium list. This may be done by telephone but **written or electronic notification must be received by the show secretary not later than closing date and time.** If written or electronic notification is not received, the dog will remain entered in the show.

LOSS WAIVER

By entering a dog at this show, the owner(s) of the dog and any agent acting on behalf of the owner(s) of the entered dog, agree that the Shetland Sheepdog Fanciers Club has the right to refuse the dog's entry for cause, in accordance with the CKC rules and regulations. In consideration of the acceptance of the dog's entry, the owner/s (or the agent acting on behalf of the owner/s), agrees to hold the Shetland Sheepdog Fanciers Club its members, directors, officers and agents, and the judge of this event, harmless from any claim for loss or injury which may allegedly be caused directly, or indirectly, to any person or thing by the act of the dog entered, while in or about the event grounds, The owner(s) and any agent acting on behalf of the owner(s), personally assume all responsibility and liability for any such claim; and by entering a dog, the owner(s) further agrees to hold the aforementioned parties harmless from any claim for loss, injury or damage to the dog entered in this show.

By entering this Show you are agreeing to the regulations that have been designed to keep us safe while together. The Show Superintendent will be in full charge of the show, which will be governed by CKC rules. All rules and regulations, as listed in the NACA premium list, will also apply to this specialty. At the time of this Premium List being posted the Government of Alberta has moved into Stage three of the "Open for Summer Plan", which means that virtually all restrictions have been lifted and all public health orders have been rescinded, with the exception of isolation and quarantine requirements and masking mandates in healthcare settings. Masking at the show is not mandatory with the following exception: If a judge is wearing a mask in the ring, please be respectful and wear your mask as well. As we are uncertain of Alberta Health Services/Government restrictions at the time of this show we ask all our dog friends to respect the rules that may be in place at the time of the show and agree to stand together ... by standing apart. Should there be any changes in the Government of Alberta's protocols we will follow all Covid Guidelines in place.

All Covid Rules MUST be followed by all exhibitors, and they may be subject to change should the Provincial or Federal Covid-19 Restriction's change

There will be no refunds on duplicate entries or overpayments.

Extracts From CKC Dog Show Rules

Chapter 8 Entries and End of Show Section

8.2.5 An error in an age specified class, date of birth or sex may be amended on the entry form up to one hour before the start of the show.

Section 8.3.1 Entries: Every dog entered in a Championship show must be one of the following:

- a) registered with the CKC,
- b) have an Event Registration Number,
- c) be eligible for registration with the CKC, or
- d) if it belongs to a listed breed, it must have a Miscellaneous Certification Number (MCN).

Section 8.4.1 Listed Dogs: If a dog is not registered as in 8.3.1 (a) or (b) but is eligible for registration with the CKC, it may be entered at a show as a listed dog provided:

- b) that if born in Canada, it is eligible for individual registration;
- c) that if not born in Canada, is eligible for registration in the records of the CKC.
- d) that if it is a foreign born and owned dog, an **Event Registration Number** or CKC registration number is obtain from the CKC within 30 days of the first show entered.

Section 8.4.2 Entry of a listed dog at a show must be accompanied by a listing fee as set by the Board in addition to the regular entry fee.

Section 8.5.1 Acceptance of Entries: If indicated in the premium list, an electronically transmitted entry may be accepted provided the entry is accompanied by a credit card charge authorization.

Section 8.5.3 No entry shall be accepted from or on behalf of any person who is officially known to be expelled, deprived of privileges, debarred or suspended by the CKC or any other registering body for pure bred dogs.

Section 8.5.4 After entries close, no further entries may be accepted, cancelled or substituted other than as otherwise stated in this section or as provided for in case of a postal strike.

Section 8.6.1 Refusal of Entries: The authorities of any show may:

- a) decline to accept entries for just cause, and/or
- b) refuse to receive or may remove any dog from the show building on account of disease or viciousness.
- c) in the case of non-acceptance, refund the fee with the reason for non-acceptance.

Section 8.8.2 Fees: Tendering of a dishonoured cheque or declined credit card in payment of an entry fee shall be considered non-payment of said fee and is an offense punishable by disciplinary action and cancellation of awards.

Section 8.9.1 Moving a Dog to Specials: A dog which is individually registered in the records of the CKC or that has a Miscellaneous Certification Number (MCN) and has completed the requirements for a Championship in accordance with these rules but at the time of the closing of entries for a show has not received confirmation of the title, may be transferred from one of the regular classes to Specials Only providing the transfer is submitted to the Show Secretary in writing by the owner or handler at least one hour prior to the opening of the show.

Section 8.9.2 If it is established that a dog transferred to Specials Only has not completed the Championship requirements, all awards will be canceled and all ribbons and prizes won shall be forfeited. The owner may also be subject to disciplinary action.

Section 8.9.3 When one or more All-Breed and/or Specialty Shows are held on the same day, in the same venue, the moving of class dogs to Specials must be made prior to the scheduled opening of the first show.

Chapter 4 Judges Section 4.1.3 A judge officiating at a show held under these rules shall not be subjected to indignities of any kind during the progress of the show. It shall be the duty and obligation of the club holding the show to see that this rule is effectively carried out.

Section 4.1.6 No person may approach a judge either directly or otherwise, orally or in writing, to favor his entry. Disciplinary action will be taken against any person who violates this rule or against a judge who fails to report any contravention of this rule to the CKC within 14 days of the act.

Chapter 14 Disqualifying or Excusing Dogs

Section 14.1.2 (a) At his discretion, a judge shall have the authority to excuse or disqualify a dog which menaces, threatens, attempts to bite or bites the judge, another person, or another dog in the ring. When a dog is twice excused on this account, it shall have the status of a disqualified dog.

(b) At his discretion, a judge shall have the authority to permanently disqualify a dog which bites the judge or another person in the ring. Dogs disqualified under this provision will not be eligible for reinstatement. The decision to permanently disqualify a dog must be clearly indicated on the Judge's Disqualification Form.

Section 14.1.4 Once a dog has been disqualified for any reason at a conformation show, it may not be entered or shown at another show until

the dog has been reinstated by the CKC. All awards earned by a dog shown in violation of this section will be cancelled by the CKC and the owner of the dog is subject to disciplinary action. A dog disqualified under section 14.1.2 (b) is not eligible for reinstatement.

Section 14.1.5 Any dog that is disqualified under section 14.1.2(a) shall automatically be disqualified from entering in any CKC event in any other discipline until such time as the dog is officially reinstated, if the dog is eligible for reinstatement.

Championship Points and Cancellations

Section 15.1.1 A dog awarded Winners at a conformation show shall be credited with a number of championship points (ranging from 0 to 5) and the number of championship points credited to a dog awarded Winners shall be as provided hereunder.

Section 15.1.2 The schedule to be employed in the determination of the number of points awarded Winners shall be as follows:

Dogs competing*	1	2	3-5	6-9	10-12	13 & more
Points allocated	0	1	2	3	4	5

*Includes the dog awarded Winners.

In counting the number of eligible dogs in competition, a dog that is disqualified, dismissed, excused or ordered from the ring by the judge shall NOT be included in the calculation for championship points.

Section 15.1.3 If a Dog awarded Winners was also awarded Best of Breed then at the show all dogs competing in the breed, including Specials Only, shall be included the total.

Section 15.1.4 If a Dog awarded Winners is also awarded Best of Opposite Sex to Best of Breed, then all dogs of the same sex including those competing for Specials Only shall be included in the total.

Section 15.1.5 If a Dog awarded Winners is also awarded Best of Winners, then all dogs defeated directly or indirectly in the breed shall be included in the total.

Section 15.1.6 If a dog is awarded Winners only, then all the dogs of the same sex in the class competition shall be included in the total.

Section 15.1.7 The number of championship points to be credited to a dog awarded Winners shall be determined by the highest award earned and calculated as per this section.

Clarification: Example of directly or indirectly defeating: If the Winners Bitch is awarded Best of Opposite Sex but not Best of Winners, the Best of Winners Male shall be deemed to have indirectly defeated the Specials Bitches, and is thus entitled to add them to the number of dogs and bitches defeated.

Section 15.1.8 In addition to championship points allocated at the breed level, a dog awarded Winners which also places in the regular Group competition shall be credited with the following additional points provided that the dog was defeated at the Group level.

Section 15.1.9 A dog may not be credited with more than 5 championship points in a single show:

Section 15.1.10 A breed or class shall not be allowed more than 2 sets of championship points per sex on any day in the same venue.

Section 15.1.11 A dog awarded Winners which also places Best in Show at an all-breed conformation show shall be credited with 5 championship points inclusive of any points earned at the breed and group level.

Section 15.1.12 In order for a dog to be recognized as a Champion and its owner provided with a Championship certificate, the dog must:

- (a) earn at least 10 championship points under at least 3 judges; and,
- (b) be individually registered in the records of the CKC or have an Event Registration Number.
- (c) have earned at least one 2 point win either at the breed or group level.

15.2 Grand Champion (GCh) (47-06-12)

Section 15.2.1 The title of Grand Champion may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation championship.

Section 15.2.2 Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the conformation championship and do not include the points earned in attaining the conformation championship.

Section 15.2.3 To be awarded a Grand Champion title, a dog must attain a minimum of 20 points, which must include a minimum of two (2) wins of at least two (2) points each. Points may be gained at breed, group or Best in Show/Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

(a) Grand Champion Point System

Points towards the Grand Champion title, at breed level, are awarded to the Best of Breed, Best of Opposite Sex, Select Dog and Select Bitch. Points are calculated based on the number of animals competing at the breed level for the Best of Breed winner and the number of similar-sex dogs competing for the other three (Best of Opposite, Select Dog, Select Bitch). The following schedule shall be employed in the determination of points awarded at breed level:

Best in Show (5 points)

(b) In order to obtain a Grand Champion title, a dog must obtain at least two (2) points after 12 months of age.

In counting the number of eligible dogs in competition, a dog that is disqualified, dismissed, excused or ordered from the ring by the judge shall not be included in the calculation for Grand Champion points.

15.3 Grand Champion Excellent (GChEx) (48-06-12)

Section 15.3.1 The title of Grand Champion Excellent may only be earned after the completion of the CKC grand championship title.

Section 15.3.2 Points for this title may be accumulated at any time after the completion of the CKC grand championship but does not include the points earned in attaining the conformation championship or the grand championship.

Section 15.3.3 A minimum of 100 points, which must include one (1) Best in Show or a Best of Breed at a breed national specialty (where a minimum of 10 dogs have competed) plus three (3) Group 1st or three (3) breed specialty wins. Grand Champion Excellent point system

Win	Points
First in Group or Best in Specialty Show	5
Second in Group or Best of Opposite Single-Breed Specialty Show	4
Third in Group	3
Fourth in Group (Note: No points are acquired if no other dog is present in the group.)	2
Best of Breed (To earn the breed point, at least five (5) dogs must be shown at breed level.)	1
Best in Show or Best in National Specialty Show	10

Section 15.3.4 Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward. For example, a dog that wins first in group and then wins Best in Show, earns 10 points, not 15.

Section 15.3.5 The title of Grand Champion Excellent shall not be awarded retroactively. However, dogs that have been awarded the Grand Champion title prior to January 1, 2013, will be awarded the Grand Champion Excellent title on application to the CKC.

Section 15.3.6 Additional Requirements

To attain a Grand Champion Excellent title, a dog must have been awarded a CKC performance title from any CKC event. A CGN, Herding Tested certificate or Chase Ability Program title are not considered performance titles for the awarding of this title.
