Award of Merit rosettes will be offered in numbers under Dog Show Rules. It shall be at the sole discretion of the judge to present such an award to any exhibit in the Specials class considered to be of outstanding quality that has not been awarded Best of Breed or Best of Opposite Sex.

PERPETUAL TROPHIES

BEST IN SPECIALTY TROPHY will be awarded to the Best of Breed Winner at the Brittany Club of Canada's National Specialty. The trophy is to remain in the possession of the BSCC President or their designate until retired. A smaller keeper trophy for the Best in Specialty will be provided to the winner.

BEST OF OPPOSITE IN SPECIALTY will be awarded to the Best of Opposite Brittany in Specialty. A rosette will also be presented as a keeper.

BEST PUPPY IN SPECIALTY will be awarded to the Best Puppy in Breed Winner. A Rosette will be presented as a keeper.

The following **Regular** Classes will be provided for both sexes:

Junior Puppy: 6 months and under 9 months on the day of the

show

Senior Puppy: 9 months and under 12 months on the day of the

show

12 to18 Months: 12 months and under 18 months on the day of the

Show

Bred by Exhibitor: For dogs owned and handled in the ring by

breeder

Canadian Bred: For dogs born in Canada, champions of any

Open: All dogs

Specials Only: Dogs of any sex individually registered with the CKC, possessing an ERN number, who have earned all points required for the Championship status at the time of the close of entries. Entry of a listed dog is not permitted in Specials only.

Exhibition Only: All dogs entered in this class will be listed in the catalogue with the same particulars as dogs entered in regular competition. Dogs entered in this class may not compete in any regular class but may enter and compete in non-regular classes.

Veteran Class: For all dogs 7 years of age or over on the day of the show. Dogs entered in this class do not compete for points but rather the winner of the veteran male and veteran female class go on to the best of breed competition(spayed or neutered dogs may compete in this class)

Non-Regular and Unofficial Classes

Dogs entered in Non-Regular Classes must be entered in one of the CKC Regular Classes, Specials Only or Exhibition Only.

Sire and Get Class: shall be for Stud Dog and two of his Get only. **Brood Bitch Class:** shall be for Brood Bitch and two of her progeny only.

Field Dog & Field Bitch: For all Brittany Spaniels who have earned a Qualifying Score at a Licensed CKC Field Dog Test (Canada) or have received a placement at a Licensed CKC Field Trial (Canada)

Altered

Baby Puppy (3-6 months)

NOTE: All Non-Regular and Unofficial Class judging will follow immediately after Best of Breed Juvenile SWEEPSTAKES

Juvenile Sweeps Juvenile Sweeps shall be for any dog 6 months up to but not including 18 months of age. To enter this class, the dog must be entered in one of the CKC Regular Classes or in Specials Only. There will be four classes in all, divided by sex.

6-9 months: for Brittany Spaniels at least 6 months of age up to but not including 9 months

9-12 months:for Brittany Spaniels at least 9 months of age up to but not including 12 months

12-18 Open: for Brittany Spaniels at least 12 months of age up to but not including 18 months

The winners of all six classes will compete for Best In Sweepstakes. A rosette will be awarded to first place in each class as well as to Best In Sweeps and Best Opposite Sex in sweeps.

Entry Fees

All entries in the non regular classes must be entered in a regular Official Class or for Exhibition Only.

All fees include the CKC recording fee and GST.

EFFECTIVE JANUARY 1, 2011 Non-member participation fee

a) An annual non-member participation fee for awards and titles will be charged to a Canadian non-member of CKC. This will match the ERN fee.
b) In order to protect the awards/titles earned, the non-member will have a choice either to become a CKC member or to pay the non-member participation fee. Failure to comply within 30 days of notification will cause all awards and titles to be cancelled.
c) These fees apply only to dogs wholly owned by non-CKC members and are not applicable to CKC members."

NO ENTRY WILL BE ACCEPTED WITHOUT PAYMENT IN FULL. Tendering of an NSF cheque in payment of entry fees will be considered non-payment of entry fees and is an offence punishable by CKC disciplinary action and cancellation of awards. The owner of a dog entered in this show is entirely responsible for any error in the entering of his dog, regardless of how, or by whom the entry was made.

RULES GOVERNING THESE SHOWS 1. THE CLUB RESERVES THE RIGHT TO REMOVE ANY PERSON FROM THE SHOW. THE SHOW SUPERINTENDENT SHALL HAVE FULL CONTROL OF THESE SHOWS AND TRIALS, WHICH WILL BE GOVERNED BY CKC RULES. 2. ANY DOG EXCUSED BY THE SHOW SUPERINTENDENT OR VETERINARIAN FOR ANY REASON SHALL NOT, COMPETE IN ANY CLASS FOR ANY AWARDS FOR THE BALANCE OF THE SHOW. 3. THE SHOW COMMITTEE WILL USE DUE CARE AND DILIGENCE FOR THE WELFARE OF DOGS AND EXHIBITORS, BUT WILL NOT BE RESPONSIBLE FOR, OR ASSUME ANY LIABILITY IN THE EVENT OF ACCIDENT OR MISFORTUNE TO EITHER DOGS, EXHIBITORS, SPECTATORS OR VENDORS. 4. DOGS MUST BE ON THE GROUNDS 1 HOUR PRIOR TO THE JUDGING OF THEIR BREED. 5. THE OWNER OF A DOG ENTERED IN THESE SHOWS IS ENTIRELY RESPONSIBLE FOR ANY ERROR IN ENTERING HIS/HER DOG REGARDLESS OF HOW OR BY WHOM THE ENTRY WAS MADE. 6. EXHIBITORS AND HANDLERS WILL BE RESPONSIBLE FOR THEIR DOGS AND EQUIPMENT LEFT AT THE SHOW GROUNDS. 7. DOGS ARE TO BE EXERCISED IN DESIGNATED AREAS ONLY, NOT IN VICINITY OF SHOW RINGS 8. ALL REACREATIONAL UNITS WILL HAVE BUCKETS UNDERNEATH FOR THEIR SINK DRAINS. ANYONE FOUND DISCHARGING WATER ON THE GROUNDS WILL BE REMOVED BY ORDER OF THE HEALTH DEPARTMENT, AND MAY BE SUBJECT TO A FINE. 9. IF, BECAUSE OF CIVIL DISTURBANCE OR OTHER ACTS BEYOND THE CONTROL OF THE CLUB, IT IS IMPOSSIBLE TO OPEN OR COMPLETE THE SHOW, THERE IS NO REFUND OF ENTRY. 10. DOGS MUST BE ON LEASH AT ALL TIMES ON THE SHOW GROUNDS OR WITHIN THE SHOW BUILDING. ALL EXHIBITORS. HANDLERS AND PATRONS ARE EXPECTED TO KNOW AND ABIDE BY THE CKC DOG SHOW RULES

SECTION #1. A dog awarded WINNERS at a Championship show held under these Dog Show Rules shall be credited with a number of championship points (ranging from 0 to 5), and the determination of the number of championship points to be credited to a dog awarded WINNERS shall be as provided hereunder. SECTION #2. The schedule to be employed in the determination of the number of points to be allocated a dog awarded WINNERS shall be as follows; DOGS COMPETING* 1 2 3 to 5 6 to 9 10 to 12 13 or more POINTS AWARDED 0 1 2 3 4 5 *includes the dog awarded Winners To determine the number of points earned by a dog awarded Winners, total all dogs in competition which were defeated, directly or indirectly, for the highest of the following official breed awards: Winners, Best of Winners, Best of Breed or Best Opposite Sex and then consult the schedule set forth above. A class dog awarded Best in Show at an allbreed Championship show will be credited with 5 points inclusive of any points earned at the breed or group level. In counting the number of eligible dogs in competition, a dog that is disqualified or that is dismissed, excused or ordered from the ring by the judge, shall NOT be included in the calculation for championship points (effective January 1, 2012) (Absentees are not to be included). In order for a dog to be recognized as a Canadian Champion it must: (1) earn at least ten championship points under at least three different judges; and (2) be individually registered in the records of the CKC or have a CKC Event Registration Number (ERN) NOTE
