

Disciplinary action will be taken against any person who violates this rule, or against a judge who fails to report any contravention of this rule to the CKC within 14 days of the action. (See Section 4.1.5)

Charlotte County Kennel Club reserves the right to refuse any entries, subject to CKC rules.

Entry Information

- 1. All entries must be received by Wednesday, August 30, 2023 at 9:00pm ADT, accompanied by the proper fees and submitted on an official CKC entry form. **Please type or print clearly.**
- Incomplete entries will be returned. Agents and Handlers, please note that full name and address of owners MUST be filled in and to whom ID's are to be returned. (Section 13.1.2, Dog Show Rules)
- 3. Exhibitors must abide by errors made in entering their dogs regardless of how or by whom entries were made.
- 4. To comply with CKC regulations, we will be unable to accept or substitute any entry reaching the Show Secretary after the closing date and time.
- 5. Only dogs entered in the Shows may enter the venue. The Committee reserves the right to refuse any entry subject to CKC rules. Service Dogs are welcome.
- 6. Personal cheques or Money orders for the full amount only will be accepted and should be made out to **The Charlotte County Kennel Club**
- 7. It is your responsibility to verify the receipt of any electronic entries prior to the advertised closing date.

We welcome all exhibitors and spectators

If you require accommodation because of a disability, please make it know to the club in advance. Please contact the Show Secretary by the closing date to ensure that we can do our best to meet your needs.

Refund Policy

The Charlotte County Kennel Club has instituted the following refund policy. If the Show is cancelled before August 30, 2023, refund shall be 100% minus Entry Service Fees.

If the show is cancelled after August 30, 2023, refund shall be 90% of entry fee, Entry Service Fees are not refundable. The remainder will be retained by the club to cover costs.

No Post Dated Cheques accepted. All NSF cheques are subject to a charge of \$25.00.

N.S.F. cheques are considered Non-payment of entry fees and are punishable by disciplinary action and cancellation of awards. All fees must be paid before the show.

GENERAL INFORMATION

These shows are outdoors. In the event of bad weather, there is no cover over the rings. The show precincts will be a 150-foot (45m) perimeter from the exterior of the rings. Exhibitors are requested to keep their grooming and crating areas clean and tidy.

The Show Superintendent will be in full charge of the show, governed by CKC rules.

If, because of riot, civil disturbance, or other acts beyond the controls of the management, it is impossible to open or complete the show or trial, no refund of Entry Fees will be made.

JL Dog Show Services and Charlotte County Kennel Club will use care and diligence for the welfare of all dogs, exhibitors and spectators, but will not be responsible for, nor assume any liability in the event of accident or misfortunes however caused.

Dogs need only to arrive 15 minutes before scheduled judging time and will be excused from each show when not required for further judging.

Waiting for dogs will not be possible and handlers with several breeds must arrange for alternate handlers if judging times for their breeds conflict.

There will not be power available to exhibitors.

ATTENTION FOREIGN EXHIBITORS

Please note that fees are due and payable in Canadian dollars. Due to consistently fluctuating currency rates, discounted cheques will not be accepted. Personal cheques will be accepted; however, they are to be payable in Canadian funds. If you send a cheque in US funds, it must be made out for the full amount of the entry and no exchange will be refunded to the exhibitor. Please do not mark cheques "Payable in Canadian Funds" or "At Par". They will not be cleared by the banks. To simplify the process, we urge that you purchase bank drafts or money orders payable in Canadian funds or enter through dogshow.ca Your understanding and cooperation is appreciated. Thank You."

GENERAL ENTRY INFORMATION

JL Dog Show Services reserves the right to refuse any entry, subject to CKC Dog Show Rules. Identification cards and judging schedule will be mailed / emailed as soon as possible after entries close.

Conflicts between Dog Show Rules and the New Breed Standards. The Board of Directors of the CKC, has ruled that where a conflict arises between the Breed Standards and the Dog Show Rules that the Dog Show Rules will take precedence. Exhibitors must abide by errors made in entering their dogs regardless of how or by whom the entry was made. Changes or cancellation of any entry after closing date is prohibited.

In the event that the dog is absent, excused by a Veterinarian or Judge, disqualified, or barred from competition by action of the bench Committee, no entry fees will be refunded.

To avoid noise and confusion, there will be no individual dogs called to the ring by loudspeaker. Delays waiting for dogs will not be possible and handlers with several breeds must arrange for alternate handlers if judging times for their breeds conflict.

Only dogs eligible for registration with CKC may enter this show and trial.

Conformation Classes

Baby Puppy A dog 4 months up to 6 months on the day of the show
Junior Puppy A dog 6 months up to 9 months on the day of the show
Senior Puppy A dog 9 months and up to 12 months on the day of the show
12-18 Months A dog 12 months and up to 18 months on the day of the show
Canadian Bred A dog which was born in Canada
Bred By Exhibitor A dog owned and handled by the breeder
Open Class A dog 6 months of age or older
Specials Only Dogs who are Canadian Champions
Exhibition Only Dogs 6 months and over, not in competition

Exhibitors are responsible for ensuring that they are entered in the correct class. Please refer to the CKC rule book.

NOTE: Baby Puppy Exhibition only puppy ~ If the puppy does not yet have a CKC Registration Number the TCN Fee is waived. Puppy must have a TCN number.

CHAMPIONS & CHAMPIONSHIP POINTS SECTION

SECTION 1: A dog awarded WINNERS at a championship show held under these Dog Show Rules shall be credited with a number of championship points (ranging from 0 to 5) and the determination of the number of championship points to be credited to a dog awarded WINNERS shall be as provided hereunder.

SECTION 2: The schedule to be employed in the determination of the number of points to be allocated a dog awarded WINNERS shall be as follows:

To determine the numbers of championship points earned by a dog awarded WINNERS total all the dogs in competition which the dog defeated, directly or indirectly, for the highest of the following official breed awards: Winners, Best of Winners, Best of Breed or Best of Opposite Sex and then consult the schedule set forth above. The new system provides for additional points (provided that the dog has defeated another as listed hereunder:

A class dog awarded Best In Show at an all-breed championship show will be credited with five points inclusive of any points earned at the breed or group level. In no case may a dog earn more than five points at any single show.

CLASSES-Divided by Sex

Jr (6-9), Sr (9-12), 12-18 Months, Canadian Bred, Bred by Exhibitor, Open, Specials Only. Baby Puppy will be offered at show #1 each day, for puppies 4-6 months.

Grand Champions and GCH Points

15.2.1 The title of Grand Champion may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation championship. 15.2.2 Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the conformation championship and do not include the points earned in attaining the conformation championship. Section 15.2.3 To be awarded a Grand Champion title, a dog must attain a minimum of 20 points, which must include a minimum of two (2) wins of at least two (2) points each. Points may be gained at breed, group or Best in Show/Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

Grand Champion Point System Points towards the Grand Champion title are attained at breed level and are awarded to Best of Breed, Best of Opposite Sex, Select Dog and Select Bitch. Points are calculated based on the number of animals competing at the breed level for the Best of Breed winner and the number of similar-sex dogs competing for the other three (Best of Opposite, Select Dog, Select Bitch).

In order to obtain a Grand Champion title, a dog must obtain at least two (2) points after 12 months of age. In counting the number of eligible dogs in competition, a dog that is disqualified, dismissed, excused or ordered from the ring by the judge shall not be included in the calculation for Grand Champion points.

Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

15.2.4 Grand Champion Bronze (GChB)

The title of Grand Champion Bronze may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation title Grand Champion is attained.

- a) Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the Grand Championship, and do not include the points earned in attaining the Grand Championship.
- b) To be awarded a Grand Champion Bronze title, a dog must attain a minimum of 50 points, which must include a minimum of two wins of at least two (2) points each. Points must be gained at breed, group or Best In Show/Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.
- c) Points accumulated prior to July 1, 2021 may be used to attain the GChB title, however, a minimum of five (5) points must be earned after July 1, 2021.

15.2.5 Grand Champion Silver (GChS)

The title of Grand Champion Silver may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation title Grand Champion Bronze is attained.

- a) Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the Grand Champion Bronze is attained, and do not include the points earned in attaining the Grand Championship Bronze.
- b) To be awarded a Grand Champion Silver title, a dog must attain a minimum of 100 points, which must include a minimum of two wins of at least two (2) points each. Points must be gained at breed, group or Best In Show/ Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

15.2.6 Grand Champion Gold (GChG)

The title of Grand Champion Gold may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation title Grand Champion Silver is attained.

- a) Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the Grand Champion Silver is attained, and do not include the points earned in attaining the Grand Championship Silver.
- b) To be awarded a Grand Champion Gold title, a dog must attain a minimum of 200 points, which must include a minimum of two wins of at least two (2) points each. Points must be gained at breed, group or Best In Show/ Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

Section 15.3 Grand Champion Excellent and GCHEX

15.3.1 The title of Grand Champion Excellent may be granted only after the completion of the CKC Grand Championship Silver Title. Exhibitors will be required to submit to Shows & Trials the Grand Champion Excellent Record Sheet documenting the additional requirements. The Grand Champion Excellent Record Sheet Form is located on the CKC website.

- 15.3.2 To earn the title a dog must have earned the following during their career as a Special:
- a) One (1) Best in Show or a Best of Breed at a breed national specialty (where a minimum of 10 dogs have competed).
- b) Three (3) Group 1st, or three (3) breed specialty Best of Breed wins.
- c) A CKC performance title from any CKC Event. Titles excluded are: CGN, Herding Novice Tested Certificate, all Instinct titles from all events, as well as all Sprinter titles and all Chase Ability Program titles.

15.3.3 Best in Show, Best of Breed at a National Specialty, three (3) Group wins, or three (3) Specialty Best of Breed wins, must be attained after the completion of a regular championship. The performance title may be attained at any time in the dog's career. NOTE: Grandfathering of the previous version of the Grand Champion Excellent title will be honoured up until December 31, 2022.

Show Etiquette

It shall be the duty and obligation of the show giving club to see that a judge, club official, volunteer, or any participant at an event is not subject to indignities. The Conformation Show Committee Chair shall promptly report to the CKC any infringement of this regulation, and the Discipline Committee shall have the authority to take such action as it deems fit on receipt of a report indicating that this has occurred. (See Section 19.7) No person may approach a judge either directly or otherwise, orally, in writing or electronically, to favour his entry. Disciplinary action will be taken against any person who violates this rule, or against a judge who fails to report any contravention of this rule to the CKC within 14 days of the action. (Conformation Show Rules and Regulations 4.1.5.)

PLEASE NOTE THE FOLLOWING: No dog may be brought onto the grounds or premises of an event if it: 1. Is known to have distemper, parvovirus, kennel cough or other communicable disease; 2. Has recovered from distemper, parvovirus, kennel cough or other communicable disease within the last 30 days (prior to the event); 3. Has been housed within 30 days prior to the event on premises on which there existed distemper, parvovirus, kennel cough or other communicable disease. Clubs do have the right to remove a dog from the event premises and the exhibitor may be subject to disciplinary action if it is found that CKC rules have been contravened.

<u>Temporary Competition Number</u> (Effective January 1, 2023)

Temporary Competition Number (TCN) must be obtained before submitting an entry for an event. The same TCN must be used for all event entries for a dog until the dog is permanently registered. Once a dog is permanently registered or has an ERN, the TCN will be replaced with the registration number or ERN. A TCN cannot be used for dogs that will require a Performance Event Number (PEN) or Canine Companion Number (CCN). Listed Breeds that do not yet have a Miscellaneous Class Number (MCN) number will be eligible to apply for a TCN.

There is no fee to obtain a TCN however exhibitors will still be required to pay TCN fees (formerly called Listing Fees) when entering events using a TCN. TCN Numbers may be obtained online via the CKC website where the number is issued instantly. Exhibitors may also mail in a printed application or contact CKC Shows and Trials by phone for a number. If your dog does not have a registration number or ERN and has already competed in a CKC event and earned points, scores or awards, before applying for a TCN online, exhibitors are encouraged to check their dog's profiles to determine if the CKC has already created a TCN for that dog. There will be a tab call TCN Dogs in the owner's Portal account

A TCN is required to enter the BABY PUPPY CLASS, however, TCN fees do not apply to baby puppies.

Event Registration Number (ERN)

All dogs that are foreign born and foreign owned and enter Canada for the sole purpose of entering CKC events will require an Event Registration Number (ERN). To obtain an ERN simply do the following:

- 1. Send a photocopy of the dog's Registration Certificate reflecting current ownership, for example AKC Registration Certificate with a written request for an ERN. 2.
- 2. Include with the above a cheque or money order in the amount currently required payable to the Canadian Kennel Club.
- 3. Ensure that you provide the CKC with your full return address to enable the ERN to be sent to you.
- 4. Faxed requests will be accepted. Please indicate your VISA/MasterCard number and expiry date, the card holders name and signature.

This Event Registration Number MUST be applied for within 30 days of the first day of entering a CKC event. Dogs may be entered as "LISTED", however, failure to apply for an ERN within 30 days will result in cancellation of any wins, awards or scores. CKC NON-MEMBER PARTICIPATION FEE

The Non-Member Participation Fee applies to dogs wholly owned by a resident of Canada who is not a member of the CKC; it is not applicable to CKC members or dogs co-owned with a CKC member. In order for the title to be awarded, the non-member will have a choice to either become a CKC member or pay the Non-Member Participation Fee. Failure to comply within 30 days of notification will result in the title being withheld and the dog cannot be moved up to the next level. (For a Membership application, please go to www.ckc.ca under CKC Services and Forms On-Line). The Non-Member Participation Fee is fee paid in the calendar year (January – December) in which the dog achieved its title and/or titles.
