# BABY PUPPY COMPETITION will be judged as part of the main breed judging.

Judging will commence at 8:00 am unless entries warrant an earlier or later starting time. All Group Judging will commence on completion of Breed Judging within each group.

It shall be the duty and obligation of the show-giving club to see that a judge, club official, volunteer or any participant at an event held under these rules is not subject to indignities. The Conformation Show Committee Chair shall promptly report to the CKC any infringement of this regulation, and the CKC shall have the authority to take such action as it deems fit on receipt of a report indicating that this has occurred. A copy of this regulation shall be prominently placed in every premium list and catalogue. (19.7)

It shall be the duty and obligation of the trial-giving club to see that a judge, club official, ring steward, volunteer or competitor at an obedience or rally trial held under these regulations is not subject to indignities of any kind. The Trial Chair shall promptly report to the CKC any infringement of this regulation, and the CKC shall have the authority to take such action as it deems fit on receipt of a report indicating that this has occurred. A copy of this regulation shall be prominently placed in every premium list and catalogue. (20.7)

No person may approach a judge either directly or otherwise, orally, in writing or electronically, to favour his entry. Disciplinary action will be taken against any person who violates this rule, or against a judge who fails to report any contravention of this rule to the CKC within 14 days of the action. (4.1.5)

Online entries, Credit Card & eTransfer payments are accepted only through The Entry Line. The Entry Line is the only authorized online entry service for these events.

A Canadian Kennel Club TCN (Listing) fee is payable if entry for dogs does not include a CKC Individual registration number. A litter registration is not acceptable. Official CKC entry forms must be used. **Please photo copy and/or print extra entry forms as required.** 

- Exhibitors entering both Obedience and Rally must fill out separate entry forms.
- Personal cheque or Money order for the full amount only will be accepted and should be made out to:

- No post dated cheques accepted. All NSF cheques will be subject to a charge of \$35.00. NSF cheques are considered non-payment of entry fees and are punishable by disciplinary action and cancellation of awards. All fees must be paid before the show.
- Entries must be submitted by mail (to the Show Secretary), hand delivered (to 214 Crossley Ave, Truro NS) or via the Entry Line. No other entry service is authorized to take entries for these events.

**Please Note:** Credit Card payments/Fax Entries/eTransfers accepted ONLY through THE ENTRY LINE. The Island Dog Club does not accept credit cards for payment.

Important Note Regarding Emails & Faxes: It will be the responsibility of the exhibitor to ensure that any electronic submission, either email, facsimile, or any document transmitted electronically, reaches the proper authority or recipient, within the times and limits as regulated for each document in the CKC Rules and Regulation. Sent fax receipts, and/or, copies of sent emails, will not be taken as evidence of receipt by recipients.

#### **REFUND POLICY**

If, because of civil disturbance or riot, extreme weather event, governmental orders, regulations or decree an act of God or any other situations beyond the control of the ISLAND DOG CLUB (other than COVID), it is impossible to open or complete the Shows, no refund of entry fees will be made. If because of Covid cancellation – ISLAND DOG CLUB will refund fees minus any costs incurred by ISLAND DOG CLUB. Please note that Entryline will NOT refund Service Fees.

# **REFUND INFORMATION ~ COMMUNICABLE DISEASES**

Entry Fees will be refunded for dogs/bitches that are posing a threat of a COMMUNICABLE DISEASE on the day of the show. To obtain the refund, a letter from a practicing Veterinarian MUST be presented to the Show Secretary prior to the commencement of the show.

**Attention Foreign exhibitors:** Please note that fees are due and payable in Canadian dollars. Due to consistently fluctuating currency rates, discounted cheques will not be accepted. Personal cheques will be accepted; however, they are to be payable in Canadian funds. If you send a cheque in US funds, it must be made out for the full amount of the entry and no exchange will be refunded to the exhibitor. Please do not mark cheques "Payable in Canadian Funds" or "At Par". They will not be cleared by the banks. To simplify the process, we urge that you purchase bank drafts or money orders payable in Canadian funds. Your understanding and cooperation is appreciated. Thank you

#### Rules

A copy of the rules pertaining to dog shows or obedience trials may be obtained from the Canadian Kennel Club. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to know the rules pertaining to these events.

# Temporary Competition Number (TCN) - Effective January 1, 2023

Temporary Competition Number (TCN) must be obtained before submitting an entry for an event. The same TCN must be used for all event entries for a dog until the dog is permanently registered. Once a dog is permanently registered or has an ERN, the TCN will be replaced with the registration number or ERN. A TCN cannot be used for dogs that will require a Performance Event Number (PEN) or Canine Companion Number (CCN). Listed Breeds that do not yet have a Miscellaneous Class Number (MCN) number will be eligible to apply for a TCN.

There is no fee to obtain a TCN however exhibitors will still be required to pay TCN Fees (formerly called Listing Fees) when entering events using a TCN.

TCN Numbers may be obtained online via the CKC website where the number is issued instantly. Exhibitors may also mail in a printed application or contact CKC Shows and Trials by phone for a number.

## **Event Registration Number (ERN)**

All dogs that are foreign born and foreign owned and enter Canada for the sole purpose of entering CKC events will require an Events Registration Number (ERN) from the Canadian Kennel Club. **Effective January 1, 2023**, the policy has been changed to allow Listed Breeds registered with a different Canadian registry to also apply for an ERN. Canadian Born dogs that are registrable by a breed association in Canada recognized by Agriculture Canada may obtain an ERN. To obtain an ERN simply do the following:

Send a photocopy of the dog's registration certificate reflecting current ownership - with a written request for an ERN. Include full payment in the amount of \$62.40 plus tax. Accounts may be paid with personal or business cheque, money order, Visa or MasterCard. For Non-Members please note that if paying by cheque, the cheque must be certified. Non-residents of Canada please note that discounted cheques or money orders will not be accepted due to fluctuating currency rates. Provide us with your full return address. - Faxed requests will be accepted. Please include your VISA/MasterCard number, expiry date, cardholder's name and signature. An ERN must be obtained within 30 days of obtaining points, awards or scores to avoid cancellation. If factors beyond your control prohibits this or presents a problem, please send a written request for a 30 day extension. Please forward your request to:

#### ATTENTION ALL CANADIANS WHO ARE NOT CKC MEMBERS

Effective January 1, 2011, the CKC has instituted an annual Non-Member Participation Fee for awards and titles for a CANADIAN non-member of the CKC. These fees apply only to dogs wholly owned by a resident of Canada who is not a member of the CKC; it is not applicable to CKC members or dogs co-owned with a CKC member. In order for the title to be awarded, the non-member will have a choice to either become a CKC member or pay the Non-Member Participation Fee. Failure to comply within 30 days of notification will result in the title being withheld and the dog cannot be moved up to the next level. (For a Membership application, please go to <a href="https://www.ckc.ca">www.ckc.ca</a> under CKC Services and Forms On-Line.) The Non-Member Participation Fee is fee paid in the calendar year (January – December) in which the dog achieved its title and/or titles.

#### **ENTRY INFORMATION**

- 1. All entries are to be sent to the Show Secretary and must be received on or before the closing date and time. Official CKC Entry Forms MUST be used. Please PRINT OR TYPE YOUR ENTRIES. Remember your entry can only be as accurate as the information you provide. The Show Secretary is NOT RESPONSIBLE for incorrect information provided by the entrant. Moving class dogs to specials is permitted. An error in the class, date of birth or sex many be amended on the entry form up to one hour before the start of the show.
- 2. No entry will be accepted unless accompanied by proper entry fees and forms.
- 3. Incomplete entries will be returned. Agents and Handlers please note that full name and address of owners must be filled in.
- 4. Exhibitors must abide by errors made in entering their dogs regardless of how or by whom entries were made.
- 5. To comply with CKC regulations, we will be unable to accept or substitute any entry reaching the show/trials Secretary after the closing date and time.
- 6. Only a dog individually registered, or eligible to be registered, in the stud book of the CKC may compete in these shows. The Committee reserves the right to refuse any entry subject to CKC rules.
- 7. All entry confirmations and Judging Schedules will be sent as soon as possible after entries close.
- 8. It is YOUR RESPONSIBILITY TO VERIFY the receipt of any electronic entries prior to the advertised closing date. A valid means of payment must accompany all entries.

#### **GENERAL INFORMATION**

- The Island Dog Club, its officers, associates and Show Committee, will use due care and diligence for the safety and welfare of the dogs and exhibitors but will not be responsible for, or assume any liability in the event of an accident or misfortune, to either dogs, exhibitors, or patrons. The Island Dog Club will not be responsible for equipment left in the building or on site overnight.
- The Superintendent will be in complete charge of these shows and trials, which are governed by CKC rules
- For set-up purposes, the building will be open on Friday, October 27 from 4:00 pm to 7:00 pm SHARP!.
- The building will be open 1 hour prior to the start of judging each day of the show (see Judging Schedule).
- As per PEI regulations, **NO SMOKING** is allowed in public places. No Smoking is allowed within 15 feet of the entry of a public building.
- NO DOGS ARE ALLOWED TO BE LEFT IN THE BUILDING OVERNIGHT.
- BAIT MUST NOT BE THROWN on the conformation ring floors.
- Dogs should be on standby at their respective areas 30 minutes prior to commencement of judging. Judges are not required to wait for late arrivals and will adhere as closely as possible to the Judging Schedule. There will be no PA system used to call dogs to the ring. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to have the dog in the ring when the dog's class is called to be judged. It is the responsibility of the owner/handler to advise that a dog is absent.
- Handlers and exhibitors with several breeds must arrange for alternative handlers should judging times of different breeds conflict
- Due to the limited amount of space, the Superintendent may be required to control the number of and/or area taken up

- by x-pens. All exhibitors are required to co-operate with the Superintendent in this regard.
- Only a dog individually registered, or eligible to be registered, in the stud book of the Canadian Kennel Club may compete in these shows and trials.
- Please keep your dogs crated when unattended, and clean up after your dogs.
- SHOW PRECINCTS The precincts of these shows shall be the designated area where the shows and trials are being held within the Eastlink Centre.
- Parking for exhibitors is to the side of the building at the Park Street Parking Lot. Upon unloading your vehicle it must be immediately moved to the side parking lot. DO NOT PARK IN THE FRONT PARKING LOT OR YOUR VEHICLE MAY BE TOWED AT YOUR OWN EXPENSE. OVERNIGHT CAMPERS AND RV PARKING IS FORBIDDEN ON EASTLINK PROPERTY

Baby Puppy A dog 4 months up to 6 months on the day of the show Junior Puppy A dog 6 months up to 9 months on the day of the show

Senior Puppy A dog between 9 months and up to 12 months on the day of the show 12-18 Months A dog between 12 months and up to 18 months on the day of the show

Canadian Bred A dog which was born in Canada

Bred by Exhibitor A dog owned and handled by the breeder

Open Class A dog 6 months of age or older Specials Only Dogs who are Canadian Champions

Exhibition Only Dogs 6 months and over, not in competition.

Veteran Class Dogs Must be 7 years of age and over on the day of the show. Dogs entered in this class may be

spayed or neutered.

Altered class For sexually altered dogs only

**NOTE:** 4–6-month Exhibition only puppy~ if the puppy does not yet have a CKC Registration Number the Listing Fee is waived.

#### **CHAMPIONS & CHAMPIONSHIP POINTS**

SECTION 1: A dog awarded WINNERS at a championship show held under these Dog Show Rules shall be credited with a number of championship points (ranging from 0 to 5) and the determination of the number of championship points to be credited to a dog awarded WINNERS shall be as provided hereunder.

SECTION 2: The schedule to be employed in the determination of the number of points to be allocated a dog awarded WINNERS shall be as follows:

Dogs Competing:	1	2	3-5	6-9	10-12	13 or more
POINTS ALLOCATED*	0	1	2	3	4	5

<sup>\*</sup>Includes the dog awarded WINNERS

To determine the numbers of championship points earned by a dog awarded WINNERS total all the dogs in competition which the dog defeated, directly or indirectly, for the highest of the following official breed awards: Winners, Best of Winners, Best of Breed or Best of Opposite Sex and then consult the schedule set forth above. The new system provides for additional points (provided that the dog has defeated another as listed hereunder):

A class dog awarded Best In Show at an all-breed championship show will be credited with five points inclusive of any points earned at the breed or group level. In no case may a dog earn more than five points at any single show.

# **Grand Champions and GCH Points**

15.2.1 The title of Grand Champion may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation championship. 15.2.2 Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the conformation championship and do not include the points earned in attaining the conformation championship. Section 15.2.3 To be awarded a Grand Champion title, a dog must attain a minimum of 20 points, which must include a minimum of two (2) wins of at least two (2) points each. Points may be gained at breed, group or Best in Show/Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

a) Grand Champion Point System Points towards the Grand Champion title are attained at breed level and are awarded to Best of Breed, Best of Opposite Sex, Select Dog and Select Bitch. Points are calculated based on the number of animals competing at the breed level for the Best of Breed winner and the number of similar-sex dogs competing for the other three (Best of Opposite, Select Dog, Select Bitch).

The following schedule shall be employed in the determination of points awarded at breed level for all levels of GCh:

b) The following schedule shall be employed in the determination of points awarded at group level for all levels of GCh:

- c) In order to obtain a Grand Champion title, a dog must obtain at least two (2) points after 12 months of age. In counting the number of eligible dogs in competition, a dog that is disqualified, dismissed, excused or ordered from the ring by the judge shall not be included in the calculation for Grand Champion points.
- d) Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.
- 15.2.4 Grand Champion Bronze (GChB)

The title of Grand Champion Bronze may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation title Grand Champion is attained.

- a) Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the Grand Championship, and do not include the points earned in attaining the Grand Championship.
- b) To be awarded a Grand Champion Bronze title, a dog must attain a minimum of 50 points, which must include a minimum of two wins of at least two (2) points each. Points must be gained at breed, group or Best In Show/Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

c) Points accumulated prior to July 1, 2021 may be used to attain the GChB title, however, a minimum of five (5) points must be earned after July 1, 2021.

15.2.5 Grand Champion Silver (GChS)

The title of Grand Champion Silver may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation title Grand Champion Bronze is attained.

- a) Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the Grand Champion Bronze is attained, and do not include the points earned in attaining the Grand Championship Bronze.
- b) To be awarded a Grand Champion Silver title, a dog must attain a minimum of 100 points, which must include a minimum of two wins of at least two (2) points each. Points must be gained at breed, group or Best In Show/ Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.
- 15.2.6 Grand Champion Gold (GChG)

The title of Grand Champion Gold may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation title Grand Champion Silver is attained.

- a) Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the Grand Champion Silver is attained, and do not include the points earned in attaining the Grand Championship Silver.
- b) To be awarded a Grand Champion Gold title, a dog must attain a minimum of 200 points, which must include a minimum of two wins of at least two (2) points each. Points must be gained at breed, group or Best In Show/ Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

Section 15.3 Grand Champion Excellent and GCHEX Points

- 15.3.1 The title of Grand Champion Excellent may be granted only after the completion of the CKC Grand Championship Silver Title. Exhibitors will be required to submit to Shows & Trials the Grand Champion Excellent Record Sheet documenting the additional requirements. The Grand Champion Excellent Record Sheet Form is located on the CKC website.
- 15.3.2 To earn the title a dog must have earned the following during their career as a Special:
- a) One (1) Best in Show or a Best of Breed at a breed national specialty (where a minimum of 10 dogs have competed). b) Three (3) Group 1st, or three (3) breed specialty Best of Breed wins.
- c) A CKC performance title from any CKC Event. Titles excluded are: CGN, Herding Novice Tested Certificate, all Instinct titles from all events, as well as all Sprinter titles and all Chase Ability Program titles.
- 15.3.3 Best in Show, Best of Breed at a National Specialty, three (3) Group wins, or three (3) Specialty Best of Breed wins, must be attained after the completion of a regular championship. The performance title may be attained at any time in the dog's career.

NOTE: Grandfathering of the previous version of the Grand Champion Excellent title will be honoured up until December 31, 2022.

#### **ENTRY CONFIRMATION & JUDGING SCHEDULE**

Judging schedules and Receipt of Entry and Arm Band Numbers will be emailed to all entrants.

To speed up the process of picking up your armbands - please know your armband #(s) before arriving at the Show Secretary table.

The Judging Schedule will be also posted on the www.canuckdogs.com No extra schedules will be available on site.
