As an all breed handler I became know as a Cavalier specialist as well and piloted 15 different dogs amongst the 100 plus champions to all breed best in show and specialty wins on both sides of the border. After Garrett's untimely death, I continued our breeding plans under the Halfmoon prefix and continue to this day many in close partnership with long-standing friends in the breed along with my partner the Tall One.

My first CFSO specialty was on June 25th, 1994, where I had the good luck to win winners dog and best puppy with a homebred puppy and Best of Specialty with Multi Champion Kindrum Sylvester of Brynwood. It is hard to believe so many years have gone by and that my journey in dogs now brings me to the center of the ring amongst you all and that my passion for the breed has not declined.

CATALOGUES

Catalogues will **only** be available on a PRE-ORDER basis. Catalogues will **not** be available for sale at the show.

TEMPORARY COMPETITION NUMBER

A Temporary Competition Number (TCN) allows dogs to temporarily participate in CKC events while they pursue permanent registration or an Event Registration Number (ERN).

A TCN must be obtained before submitting an entry for an event.

The same TCN must be used for all event entries for a dog until the dog is permanently registered or has an ERN.

A TCN cannot be used for dogs that require a Miscellaneous Certificate Number (MCN).

TCNs can be obtained:

- Online through CKC's Portal (Note: Individuals who have not yet used the online Portal will be required to create a Portal account before they can submit a TCN application online);
- By submitting a completed paper application by mail to CKC; or
- By contacting the Shows & Trials Division Toll Free: 1-855-364-7252.

Note: There is no CKC fee to obtain a TCN. However, a TCN 'listing' fee is required each time a dog with only a TCN is entered in an event.

EVENT REGISTRATION NUMBER

All dogs that are foreign born and foreign owned and enter Canada for the sole purpose of entering CKC events will no longer require a CKC registration number but will require an Event Registration Number (ERN).

The ERN number MUST be applied for within 30 days of the first day of entering a CKC event.

Fee is \$62.40 per dog, plus applicable taxes.

NON-MEMBER PARTICIPATION FEE

Effective January 1, 2011:

- a) A non-member participation fee will be charged to a resident of Canada who is a non-member of the CKC. The fee will be \$62.40 plus applicable taxes.
- b) The non-member participation fee is paid in any year a title is earned and covers all titles and dogs owned by that individual.
- c) In order for the title to be awarded, the non-member will have a choice to either become a CKC member or pay the non-member participation fee. Failure to comply within 30 days of notification will result in the title being withheld and the dog cannot be moved up to the next level.
- d) The fee applies only to dogs wholly owned by non-member residents of Canada and is not applicable to CKC members.

CONFORMATION SHOW RULES AND REGULATIONS

The Exhibitor is responsible for knowing and complying with the Conformation Show Rules and Regulations of the Canadian Kennel Club.

Chapter 4 Section 4.7.3 states: A judge officiating at a show held under these rules shall not be subjected to indignities of any kind during the progress of the show. It shall be the duty and obligation of the club holding the show to see that this rule is effectively carried out.

MOVING CLASS DOGS TO SPECIALS

Chapter 8, Section 8.9 of the Conformation Show Rules and Regulations has been amended to allow a dog which is individually registered in the records of the Canadian Kennel Club, and has completed the requirements for a Championship, after the Closing Date for entries for a show, may be transferred from one of the Regular Classes to "Specials Only," providing the request for a transfer is submitted to the Show Secretary in WRITING at least one hour prior to the judging of your breed by the owner or handler.

When one or more all-breed and/or specialty shows are held on the same day, in the same venue, the request for moving of class dogs to Specials Only must be made a minimum of one (1) hour prior to the breed judging scheduled start of the show for which the dog is being moved up to Specials Only.

Also by signing this form, I certify that I will not hold the Show giving Club, its members, directors, employees or agents liable in the event of any accident of misfortune however caused.

ENTRY INFORMATION

- 1. No entry will be accepted unless all particulars called for on the entry form are completed in full. Handlers or agents please note the full name and address of all owners must be filled in.
- 2. Incomplete entries will be returned. No entry will be accepted unless accompanied by entry fees. Telephone and telegraph entries cannot be accepted. Exhibitors must abide by errors made in entering their dogs regardless of how or by whom the entries were made.
- 3. There is no refund for duplicate cheques. Every effort will be made to find all duplicate entries, however if the entry has been processed and appears in the official catalogue, no refund will be made.
- 4. Substitutions or cancellations of any entry after the closing date is prohibited. Moving Class Dogs to Specials is permitted. An error in the class, date of birth or sex may be amended on the entry form up to one hour before the start of the show. Only dogs which are already registered in the Canadian Kennel Club Stud Book, or are eligible for such registration can be entered. The committee reserves the right to refuse any entry subject to CKC Rules.
- 5. ENTRIES POSITIVELY CLOSE 8:00 P.M. TUESDAY, AUGUST 3, 2021, and must be in the hands of the Show Secretary by that date.
- 6. Identification cards and judging schedules will be mailed as soon as possible after the entries close. Identification cards must be presented upon arrival at the show.
- 7. Tendering of NSF cheques in payment of fees shall be considered non-payment of fees and is punishable by disciplinary action. Any NSF cheques will be subject to a \$35 service charge.

GENERAL INFORMATION

- 1. The Show Superintendent will be in full charge of the show which will be governed by CKC Rules.
- 2. If, because of riot, civil disturbance or other acts beyond the control of management, it is impossible to open or to complete the show, no refund of Entry will be made.
- 3. Dogs should arrive in adequate time for their judging (allowing for absentees) and will be excused when not required for further judging. It is the responsibility of the exhibitors to have the dog at ringside when the dog's class is scheduled for judging. Waiting for dogs will not be possible and handlers with several dogs must arrange for alternate handlers.
- 4. Judging will commence at 8 a.m. A later starting time may be specified in the judging schedule. Starting time of each ring will be specified in the judging schedule.
- 5. SHOW PRECINCTS: The area set out for the show ring, including a 10-foot perimeter and the assembly area.
- 6. Please clean up after your dogs to ensure the grounds are left in proper condition.

CFSO REGIONAL SPECIALTY SHOW SAFETY PROTOCOL

Please note that if you cannot comply with these rules then do not enter or attend! The show site is not open to the general public.

UPON ARRIVAL AT THE VENUE

To expedite the arrival process, please complete the waiver and health declaration forms for all occupants of the vehicle prior to arrival. Upon arrival, you will be asked a series of Covid-19 screening questions by our volunteers. Waivers must be completed, signed, and handed in to the CFSO by all persons **before** being admitted to the venue. **No exceptions.**

No public catalogue will be available. Know your number(s) when you arrive at the venue. You will then be provided with a package of information about the show, your armband(s), wristband(s) and, if purchased, catalogue(s).

For the safety of our volunteers, exhibitors, and their dogs, please observe the posted speed limits and follow the instructions of our parking volunteers as they direct you to your campsite.

CAMPSITE

Exhibitors can socialize within their social bubble at their designated campsite. Masks must be worn when not within your social bubble if physical distancing cannot be guaranteed. Pop-up tents, dog grooming, x-pens are allowed at your designated campsite. Don't forget to bring your own chairs.

SHOW RING

Masks must be worn correctly over mouth and nose while in the show ring. Note that the show ring has no ropes and should be entered/exited from all sides based on proximity to your campsite. Physical distancing of 2 metres (6 ft) between exhibitors must be observed in the ring. The table in the show ring will be cleaned frequently. Personal belongings cannot be left at ringside.

FOOD & BEVERAGES

No food is available on site. Please **bring** and **remo**ve your own food and beverages. Fast food restaurants are located nearby in Bradford.

PERSONAL BEHAVIOUR

Avoid shaking hands, hugging, or other physical contact. Avoid touching dogs that are not your responsibility.

Please exercise your dog(s) in the designated area and be sure to pick up after your dog and use the poop can for disposal of waste.

Please take your trash (masks, gloves, water bottles, etc.) home with you.

REFUND POLICY

The CFSO has instituted the following refund policy. After closing and up to August 13th, 8:00 AM ET, a refund of 90 percent will be provided if the Show is cancelled. Service fees added by entry services are not refundable by the club.

The remainder will be retained by the Club to cover costs. As of August 13th at 8:00 AM ET, there shall be no refunds.

CHAMPIONS AND CHAMPIONSHIP POINTS

Section 15.1.1 A dog awarded Winners at a conformation show shall be credited with a number of championship points (ranging from 0 to 5) and the number of championship points credited to a dog awarded Winners shall be as provided hereunder.

Section 15.1.2 The schedule to be employed in the determination of the number of points to be allocated a dog awarded WINNERS shall be as follows:

Dogs competing*	1	2	3 to 5	6 to 9	10 to 12	13 or more
Points allocated	0	1	2	3	4	5
*includes the doa aw	<i>rarded</i>	Winners				

In counting the number of eligible dogs in competition, a dog that is disqualified, dismissed, excused or ordered from the ring by the judge <u>SHALL NOT</u> be included in the calculation for championship points.

To determine the number of championship points earned by a dog awarded Winners, total all the dogs in competition which the dog defeated, directly or indirectly, for the highest of the following official breed awards: Winners, Best of Winners, Best of Breed, or Best of Opposite Sex and then consult the schedule set forth above.

Section 15.1.8 In addition to championship points allocated at the breed level, a dog awarded Best of Breed that also places in the regular group competition shall be credited with the following additional points, provided that a dog was defeated at the group level.

Section 15.1.11 A class dog awarded Best in Show at an all-breed Championship show will be credited with five points inclusive of any points earned at the breed or group level.

Section 15.1.12 In order for a dog to be recognized as a Champion and its owner provided with a Championship Certificate, the dog must have earned at least one 2-point win either at the breed or group level.

GRAND CHAMPIONS AND GCH POINTS

Section 15.2.1 The title of Grand Champion may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation championship.

15.2.2 Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the conformation championship and do not include the points earned in attaining the conformation championship.

Section 15.2.3 To be awarded a Grand Champion title, a dog must attain a minimum of 20 points, which must include a minimum of two (2) wins of at least two (2) points each. Points may be gained at breed, group or Best in Show/Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

 a) Grand Champion Point System Points towards the Grand Champion title, are attained at breed level and are awarded to Best of Breed, Best of Opposite Sex, Select Dog and Select Bitch. Points are calculated based on the number of animals competing at the breed level for the Best of Breed winner and the number of similar-sex dogs competing for the other three (Best of Opposite, Select Dog, Select Bitch). The following schedule shall be employed in the determination of points awarded at breed level for all levels of GCh:

- c) In order to obtain a Grand Champion title, a dog must obtain at least two (2) points after 12 months of age. In counting the number of eligible dogs in competition, a dog that is disqualified, dismissed, excused or ordered from the ring by the judge shall not be included in the calculation for Grand Champion points.
- d) Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

Section 15.2.4 Grand Champion Bronze (GChB)

The title of Grand Champion Bronze may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation title Grand Champion is attained.

- a) Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the Grand Championship, and do not include the points earned in attaining the Grand Championship.
- b) To be awarded a Grand Champion Bronze title, a dog must attain a minimum of 50 points, which must include a minimum of two wins of at least two (2) points each. Points must be gained at breed, group or Best In Show/Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.
- c) Points accumulated prior to July 1, 2021 may be used to attain the GChB title, however, a minimum of five (5) points must be earned after July 1, 2021.

Section 15.2.5 Grand Champion Silver (GChS)

The title of Grand Champion Silver may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation title Grand Champion Bronze is attained.

- a) Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the Grand Champion Bronze is attained, and do not include the points earned in attaining the Grand Championship Bronze.
- b) To be awarded a Grand Champion Silver title, a dog must attain a minimum of 100 points, which must include a minimum of two wins of at least two (2) points each. Points must be gained at breed, group or Best In Show/ Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

Section 15.2.6 Grand Champion Gold (GChG)

The title of Grand Champion Gold may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation title Grand Champion Silver is attained.

- a) Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the Grand Champion Silver is attained, and do not include the points earned in attaining the Grand Championship Silver.
- b) To be awarded a Grand Champion Gold title, a dog must attain a minimum of 200 points, which must include a minimum of two wins of at least two (2) points each. Points must be gained at breed, group or Best In Show/ Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

GRAND CHAMPION EXCELLENT AND GCHEX POINTS

The title of Grand Champion Excellent may be granted only after the completion of the CKC Grand Championship Silver Title. Exhibitors will be required to submit to Shows & Trials the Grand Champion Excellent Record Sheet documenting the additional requirements. The Grand Champion Excellent Record Sheet Form is located on the CKC website.

Section 15.3.2 To earn the title a dog must have earned the following during their career as a Special:

- a) one (1) Best in Show or a Best of Breed at a breed national specialty (where a minimum of 10 dogs have competed).
- b) three (3) Group 1st, or three (3) breed specialty Best of Breed wins.
- c) a CKC performance title from any CKC Event. Titles excluded are: CGN, Herding Novice Tested Certificate, all Instinct titles from all events, as well as all Sprinter titles and all Chase Ability Program titles.

Section 15.3.3 Best in Show, Best of Breed at a National Specialty, three (3) Group wins, or three (3) Specialty Best of Breed wins, must be attained after the completion of a regular championship. The performance title may be attained at any time in the dog's career.

NOTE: Grandfathering of the previous version of the Grand Champion Excellent title will be honoured up until July 1, 2022.

SPECIALTY CONFORMATION CLASSES BOTH SEXES

REGULAR CLASSES:

JUNIOR PUPPY – A dog between 6 months and under 9 months on day of show.

SENIOR PUPPY – A dog between 9 months and under 12 months on day of show.

12-18 MONTHS – A dog between 12 months and under 18 months on day of show.

CANADIAN BRED - A dog born in Canada.

BRED BY EXHIBITOR – Dogs owned and handled in the ring by the breeder. The handler must be the owner/co-owner AND breeder/co-breeder of the dog. The breeder/owner must handle the dog in this class, but need not handle the dog for further awards.

OPEN CLASS – For all dogs.

VETERANS CLASS – For all dogs over 7 years of age as of the date of the show. These dogs to compete for the regular placements, and the 1st-place dog and bitch will go on to compete for Best of Breed. Veterans may be broken down into separate age categories. The winner of the Veterans Class will not compete for points but go directly into the Best of Breed competition. Dogs entered in this class may be spayed or neutered.

SPECIALS ONLY – Dogs that are Canadian Champions.

NON-REGULAR & UNOFFICIAL CLASSES:

2020 PUPPY – Open to any dog that would have been a puppy or Baby Puppy on June 28, 2020.

BABY PUPPY – A dog between 4 months and under 6 months on day of show. Baby Puppies do not compete for points.

STUD DOG – For dogs that have sired two dogs or bitches entered in a class or for exhibition only in this show. The award will be based on the merits of the get. The owner of the stud dog need not be the owner of the get. As the judge's decision in this class will be based on the merits of more than one dog or bitch, no one of the dogs or bitches making up the entry judged first in the class, will be eligible to compete for Best of Breed by virtue of having won this class. The Stud Dog must appear in the ring with his get and be entered in the Stud Dog Class.

BROOD BITCH – For bitches that have whelped two dogs or bitches entered in a class or for exhibition only in this show. The award will be based on the merits of the produce. The owner of the brood bitch need not be the owner of the produce. As the judge's decision in this class will be based on the merit of more than one dog or bitch, no one of the dogs or bitches making up the entry judged first in the class will be eligible to compete for Best of Breed by virtue of having won this class. The Brood Bitch must appear in the ring with her produce and be entered in the Brood Bitch Class.

BRACE – For two dogs of the same breed (not necessarily of the same sex). A brace must be handled by one person on one lead. Ownership in this class need not be identical.

EXHIBITION ONLY – All dogs entered in this class shall be listed in the catalogue with the same particulars as dogs entered in Regular competition. Dogs entered in this class may not compete in any Regular class but may enter and compete in Non-Regular/Unofficial classes and/or Parades.
